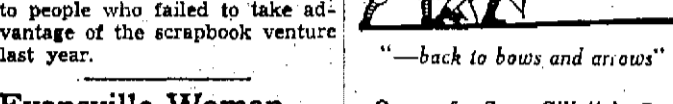

This (some of our officials think) is a foolish business, tends to delay the mails, and is apt to be fruitful of annoyance.

In his last five talks with Adolf Hitler, the British Ambassador to Berlin, Sir Neville Henderson, told him no less than 19 times that an attack would mean war with England. But almost to the end Hitler declined to believe him.

In his 33-minute speech to congress, President Roosevelt asserted no fewer than 11 times that he means to keep this country out of war. But several members still persist in their skepticism.
