# Railroads Launch Big Expansion

CHICAGO (UPI)—The railroad industry, reflecting encouraging increases in passenger and freight revenues, has launched a \$125,000,000 equipment-buying program that has boosted the steel and associated industries into the front ranks of the recovery parade, a United Press survey showed today.

The railroads, facing airplane and truck competition, long have been the problem child of big business. The buying program and a downhold which the roads have followed, except for advances in the streamlined field, during 10 years of depressions and recessions.
