3 Ace Correspondents to Discuss 'Real' War Issues Tonight

Stripped to essentials, the "real issues" of the European war will be discussed tonight by three outstanding American foreign correspondents, all intimately acquainted with the background of the conflict during America's Town Meeting of the Air.

Speakers Anne O'Hare McCormick of the New York Times, John Gunther, author of "Inside Europe" and "Inside Asia," and Jay Cooke Allen, Jr., of Esquire syndicate, will be heard on the subject, "What Are the Real Issues in the European War?" at 8:30 over WENR.

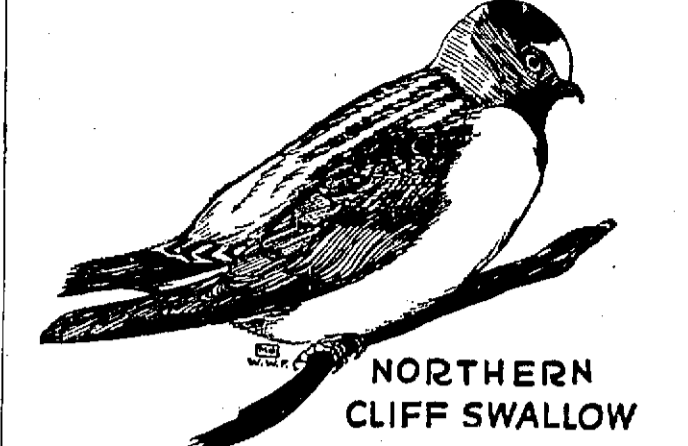

Who's Who Among Wisconsin Birds

War Seen as Menace to State Soil



The Northern Cliff Swallow is less common in Wisconsin than formerly and this is believed due to the habit of the English Sparrow to steal its nest and to people knocking down its mud nest structures.

Its nesting area runs from Central Alaska east through Canada and south over nearly all of the United States except Florida and the Rio Grande valley and along the coast district of western Mexico. It probably winters in Brazil and Argentina.

The nest is a remarkable structure, about shaped, built of mud and fastened to the face of a rocky wall or cliff under an overhanging projection or under the eaves of buildings.

Its diet consists chiefly of winged ants, wasps, a few honey bees, beetles, chinch bugs, flies, etc.
