Who's Who Among Wisconsin Birds



The Canada Jay is never seen in southern Wisconsin except when a straggler comes down from the north. Its general range is the coniferous forests of the northern portion of eastern North America and western Canada. It does not migrate and lives throughout the year where it is found. Around northern camps it is apt to become a nuisance and it becomes quite tame in search of food that is easy to obtain. It has been known to snatch bacon out of a frying pan and to steal objects for which it could have no possible use. It eats insects and their eggs, flesh of any kind, mice, and probably eggs and young of wild birds, berries, lichens, etc. It seeks scraps of all kinds about camps and dwellings. It is considered more beneficial than harmful. It is about the same size or a trifle larger than the Blue Jay, a quaker-gray bird with a soft, fluffy plumage, white about the face and with a dark-colored, short, bushy crest on the back of the head. This bird builds a large substantial nest of twigs, strips of bark, grasses and moss held together with spider webs and cocoons, and air warmly lined with feathers and hair. It is usually found six to 12 feet up in an evergreen tree. (Scrapbook page 63 of the second series of the educational program of the Wisconsin Wildlife Federation.)
