

Dramatic Presentation Is Set On Kate Smith Program

Vignettes Of American Scene Will Be Frequent Features On Hour; Nation's Grid Battles To Be Broadcast Saturday

Dramatic vignettes of the American Scene, written by leading radio playwrights and acted by the Group Theatre, will become a frequent feature of the "Kate Smith Hour" commencing Friday over WABC at 8 p. m. (EST).

Kate will sing "Can't Help It," "Lilacs In The Rain," "A Man and His Dreams" and "Off To See The Wizard" from the "Wizard of Oz." The Straeter group's vocal offerings will include "All Those in Favor Say 'Aye'" and "Ding Dong The Witch Is Dead."

Lieberman's "Morning's End," according to program producer, Ted Collins, is unique both in story and dramatic handling. The identical scene both opens and closes the play, a tragedy which deals with a young man who finds in love a reason to live but in losing the one he loves also loses his life.

A famed singer, a movie comedian, a flagpole sitter and a well-known writer comprise the star quartet to appear on the George Jessel "Celebrity Program" over WFAP Friday at 9:30 p. m. They are Paul Robeson, noted concert baritone, who is making his first public appearance since his recent return from Europe; Henry Armetta, one of Hollywood's funniest men who has appeared in numerous hit pictures; "Shipwreck" Kelly, whose flagpole sitting has made newspaper headlines; and Princess Kroppitkin, whose articles are featured in major magazine and newspapers.

Scenes Originally Deleted Will Be Seen In Timely Hit; Double Bill Scheduled For Quilna Preview

The picturization of Erich Maria Remarque's famous "All Quiet On The Western Front," will be seen at the Sigma theatre starting Saturday. With a new war blazing across Europe, new scenes, originally deleted, have been restored, and costly montages brought up to date. Memorable roles are recalled in the picture starring Lew Ayres, Slim Summerville and Louis Welheim.

Showing for the last time Friday at the Sigma are "Unexpected Father," with Baby Saundy, Dennis O'Keefe, and Mischa Auer, and "The Lady Vanishes."

At the Quilna Friday night two new pictures, "Heaven With a Barbed Wire Fence" and "Escape" will be filmed with the last showing of "Mr. Smith Goes to Washington," starring Jean Arthur and James Stewart. The new pictures offer two delightful romantic stories.

"The Roaring Twenties" opens Saturday at the Ohio theatre starting James Cagney and Priscilla Lane, will open Saturday at the Ohio theatre.
Based on an original story by Mark Hellinger, world-famous author and columnist, "The Roaring Twenties" deals with the exciting and incredible events of that fabulous period from the end of the World War to the stock market crash in 1929, the decade of the gun-mill, the speakeasy, the flapper, flaming youth, bootleggers and gangsters. There could be no better authority for this story than Hellinger who was covering the news for his syndicated columns all during the period.

The film opens at the close of the war, Cagney, a returned veteran, finds that his job as a garage mechanic is no longer open. To make a living, he turns to tax-dodging, but when the prohibition act is passed he finds an easier way—making and selling bootleg liquor. The film depicts his rise from a small-time bootlegger to a big-time racketeer. Rising with him are his two wartime buddies, played by Jeffrey Lynn and Humphrey Bogart. Bogart is in the racket with him as a henchman, while Lynn handles the legal end. Also on the rise with him are Gladys George, the night-club proprietor who first set him up in the bootlegging business, and Priscilla Lane, a young sister with whom he is in love, and Lynn breaks away from the unsavory connection with the bootleggers. The crash comes, and Cagney loses everything but the one taxicab that Bogart, now a big shot himself, has scotchily given him.

Prohibition is repealed and the bootleggers look for new rackets but Cagney still drives his cab, meeting Priscilla again, he learns that Lynn, now in the district attorney's office, has had notes from Bogart, indicating his life if he doesn't drop the racket investigation he is carrying on. She appeals to Cagney for help.

Besides the players already mentioned the cast includes Paul Kelly, Frank McHugh, Elizabeth Renison, and many others. Raoul Walsh directed from the screen play by Jerry Wald, Richard Macaulay and Robert Rossen, based on the original story by columnist Mark Hellinger.

On the Ohio stage Friday night will be the "Boone County Jamboree" with the picture, "Conspiracy."
