EFFECTIVE THINKING SOME OF THE cogitations of fine players may seem pretty far fetched to the average person, but in more than a modicum of cases it proves highly effective. The spectacular player might be defined as one who departs from habit oftener than others in refraining from taking ordinary finesse and otherwise. Usually those departures will be found to be based on some very definite line of reasoning.

Swims Through Oily Water

Sailor Tells Story of Ship Torpedoing

DUBLIN, Ireland (U.P.)—A young British sailor, who leaped from the battleship Royal Oak when it was torpedoed by a U-boat, told the first vivid story today of how 800 officers and men lived in the oily waters of the Scapa Flow naval base.

ONE: He had seen German U-boats voluntarily surrendering to the British because their oil was exhausted and they could not return to their bases.

TWO: The British battle cruiser, which the Germans claimed to have torpedoed at the same time the Royal Oak was sunk, was not even in the Scapa Flow at the time.

THREE: The German claim that the British airplane carrier Ark Royal had been sunk or damaged were "a joke" because he had since seen her in good condition.

Men died quickly and without much chance of escape when the Royal Oak was sunk with about 1,200 aboard, the young sailor said. Some of them couldn't swim even when they were able to escape the explosions and jump into the water, he related. But there was a note of grim humor even then as sailors shouted to each other that it was a good time to learn to swim.
