

Chester Morris Will Visit Bing Crosby Thursday Night

"The Mad Magician" Will Swap Repartee With The Old Crooner; Arnold Is Good News Show Emcee

Chester Morris, alias "Mysterious Morris the Mad Magician" and linguist Lou Holtz will invade the Music Hall Thursday, for a visit with Bing Crosby during his broadcast at 10 p. m. over WEAF. Morris has found time between movies to achieve considerable fame as an amateur magician and is a continual cause of amazement to Bing, who knows a few tricks himself. John Scott Trotter and his orchestra featuring his own arrangements, and the Music Maids will supply the music.

Edward Arnold, in his new role as master-of-ceremonies on Good News of 1940, will welcome Walter Huston back to the program for a guest appearance, Thursday over WEAF at 9 p. m., Huston's wife, Nan Sunderland, will appear opposite the famous actor in a radio drama.

A heavy volume of use of library resources which broke all previous records in the month of October was reported to the board of trustees by George G. McAfee, Librarian, at the regular monthly meeting Wednesday evening.
