





EXPLANATION OF YESTERDAY'S CARTOON CHEESE WON A WAR

In the war between Uruguay and Argentina of 1841, the two fleets engaged in a naval battle (August, 1841) near Montevideo. The Argentine fleet was commanded by the British admiral, William Brown. The Uruguayan fleet was commanded by Captain John Coc, an American. John Coc, in the Santa Maria, ran out of cannon balls, altho he still had some powder left. The fate of the war and of the Uruguayan republic was about to be decided, because the Uruguayan fleet was at Admiral Brown's mercy. Suddenly Coe noticed some hard round objects lying on deck. "What are those," he inquired. "They are some hard Dutch cheeses we bought today which cannot be cut but have to be sawed apart." "Why can't we use them as cannon balls?" asked Coc. Orders were immediately issued to load the cheeses into the guns. When the first broadside struck Admiral Brown's ship "25 de Mayo" there was a great consternation on board the Argentine flagship. "What is the enemy firing at us?" At the next broadside, Brown ordered his fleet to turn, and the fleet and country of Uruguay were saved.
