Swingstress Kay Thompson and her group will swing Vernon Duke's "I Can't Get Stated With You," and join the entire cast in

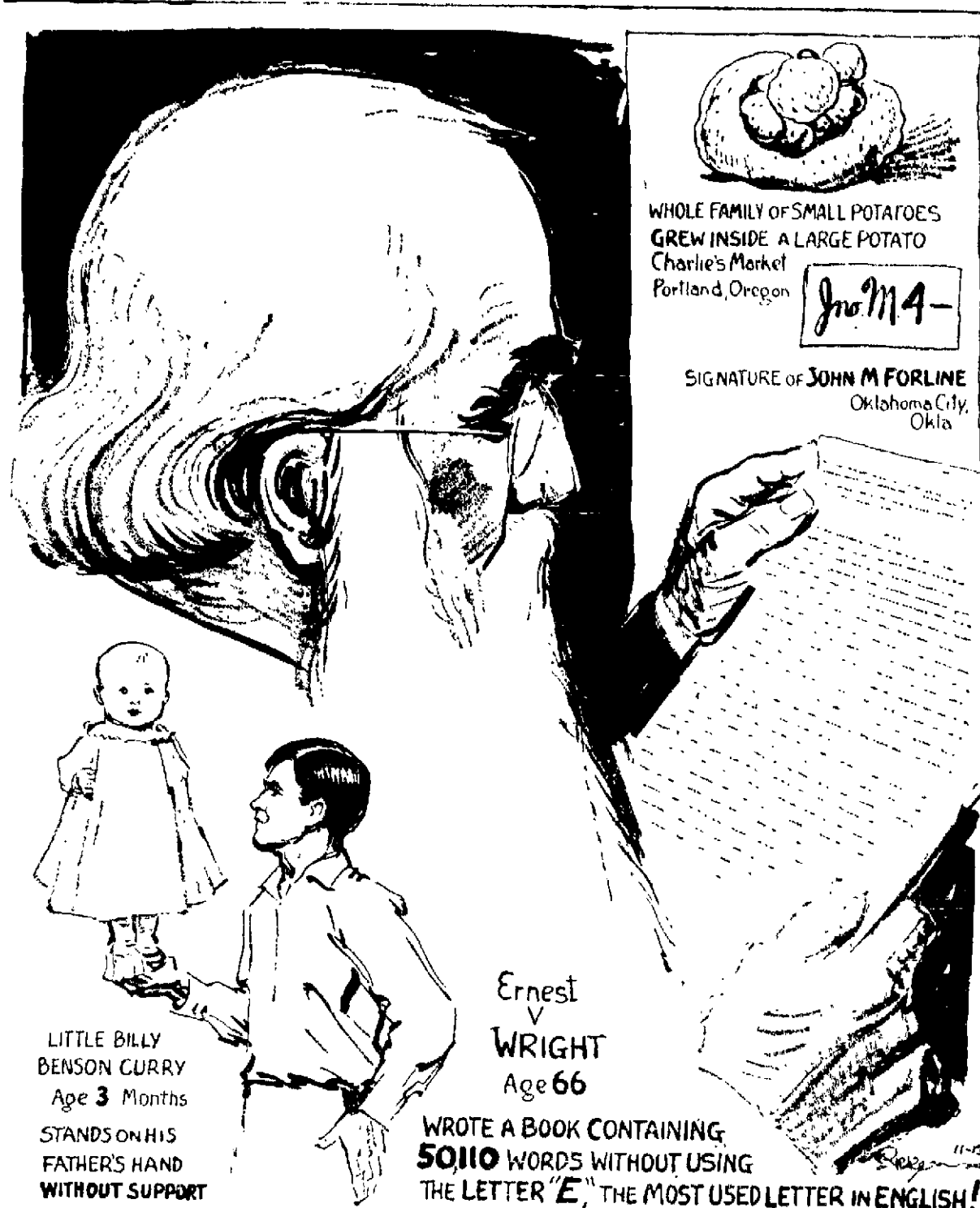

BOARD RETAINS COORDINATOR

Industrial Commission Hires Federal Statistician To Satisfy Critics

COLUMBUS, O., Nov. 13—(AP) —Replying to criticism of its operations, the Ohio Industrial Commission has selected Marshall Dawson of the Federal Bureau of Labor statistics to coordinate its activities.

Chairman John W. Beall declared today that Dawson's appointment for one year at \$4,000 was "at least part" of the commission's answer to accusations of "claxity and mismanagement" by the Citizens Tax League of Ohio.

As its advisor, Dawson will conduct research and coordinate activities of the department, Beall said, with the approval of Gov. John W. Bricker, the Ohio Manufacturers' Assn and the Ohio State Federation of Labor.

The league told Gov. Bricker two months ago that the state was being deprived of \$1,000,000 yearly thru failure to collect premium payments from 3,400 Ohio employers, while \$2,000,000 in uncollected premiums and \$500,000 in refunds to employees "has buried in the state's 300,000 unaudited payrolls now in hand."

Commissioner Clarence Knisley, who recently outlined a 10-point program for improving commission operations, expressed opposition to Dawson's selection.

"I still believe the difficulties could be remedied by the industrial commission itself," Knisley asserted.

Knisley urged elimination of state operating appropriations by deducting a certain percentage from premium receipts, and placing premium payments on a quarterly basis, with audits once in five years.
