FDR to Dedicate His Memorial Library on Air Today at 2

Station WBBM and WENR listeners will hear President Roosevelt today at 2 p. m. when he speaks at the cornerstone-laying exercises of the Franklin D. Roosevelt Memorial Library at Hyde Park, N. Y.

The library, which was dedicated to the government, will house more than 6,000,000 manuscripts, collected during the 40 years of the president's public career. The structure will be erected at a cost of \$350,000.

Twins Aides Confess Eight Thefts

Confessions by twin brothers, Thomas and Joseph Crimmins, 20, of 140 Rodney ct., Saturday brought to eight the burglaries carried out by the pair and two accomplices in Madison this year.

The brothers, returned Friday from Ft. Sheridan, Ill., where they were members an artillery unit, pleaded guilty in superior court to charges of burglary. Prosecutor sent them to jail to await sentence.

The accomplices, Arnold Stevens, 21, of 168 Proudfitt st., and Arthur H. Westoby, 26, of 148 Rodney ct., await sentence after pleading guilty to similar charges in court Thursday.

Burglaries solved by the arrest of the four, with members of the group participating in each were: March 10, Johnny's tavern, 703 W. Main, by Stevens and the brothers; April 1, by Joseph Crimmins, Westoby and Stevens; Sept. 1 and Oct. 15, by Westoby and Thomas Crimmins.

Oct. 9 and 15, People's Fruit market, 1113 S. Park st., by Westoby and Thomas Crimmins. July 3 and Aug. 18, Bee's tavern, 1109 S. Park st., by Westoby and Thomas Crimmins. Thomas Crimmins and Westoby also confessed they stole six or seven automobile wheels and tires.

The quartet stole more than \$250 worth of liquor, \$47 in cash, five boxes of cigars and 15 cartons of cigarettes in their eight burglaries. Most of the liquor was turned over to Westoby, who hid it in a closet at Normandale sanitarium, he said Saturday in court. Westoby had been employed as attendant at the sanitarium. Some he gave to friends, the rest he sold for \$1 a quart, he added, but when suspicion fell on him about a week ago, he said he destroyed 30 or 40 quarts.
