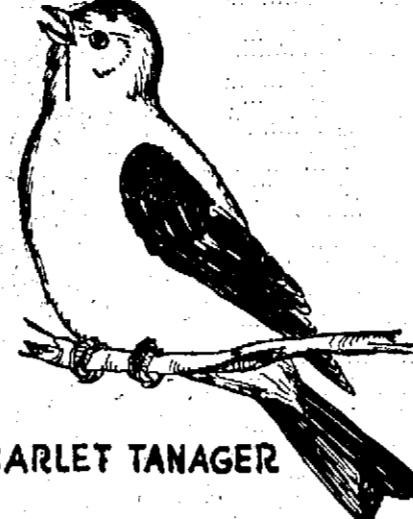

### Cornell Bids for Lead in National Grid Race

NEW YORK (AP)—Cornell, that slumbering titan of the east, commanded new respect throughout the football realm today after snapping out of its temporary torpor and treating the nation to the weekend's most impressive display of gridiron power.

The "Big Red" team, king of the Ivy league, maintained its perfect record by crushing Dartmouth, 35-6, while three others of the nation's mythical title contenders were meeting with reverses: Oklahoma, North Carolina, and U. C. L. A.

Carl Snavely's Reds from Ithaca proved that their previous triumph over powerful Ohio State was no fluke as they smacked Dartmouth's Indians all over the Hanover field and held them helpless, until Snavely sent in his third team in the last period, and the Indians made their lone tally, aided by a pass interference penalty. Not since Jim Dobie's steam rollers of 1921, '22 and '23 has a Cornell team looked so irresistible.

No such success attended the efforts of that supposed midwestern powerhouse, Oklahoma, which suffered its first defeat when shaded 7-6 by Missouri. It was the Sooners' first loss in 22 regular-season games, although they were trounced in the post-season Orange Bowl, classic by Tennessee.

Similarly the unbeaten North Carolina Tar Heels bit the dust for the first time when humbled 13-3 by Duke's Blue Devils. Also U. C. L. A., although still unbeaten, suffered its second tie of the season when held to a scoreless deadlock by robust Santa Clara.

These results left six survivors in the national race—teams having perfect records or only one on their slates—Tennessee, Texas A&G, Cornell, Southern California, Tulane, and Duquesne. Four of these teams won their games Saturday while Southern California and Duquesne rested in preparation for stiff tilts this week. Competition over the weekend may be sectionalized as follows:
