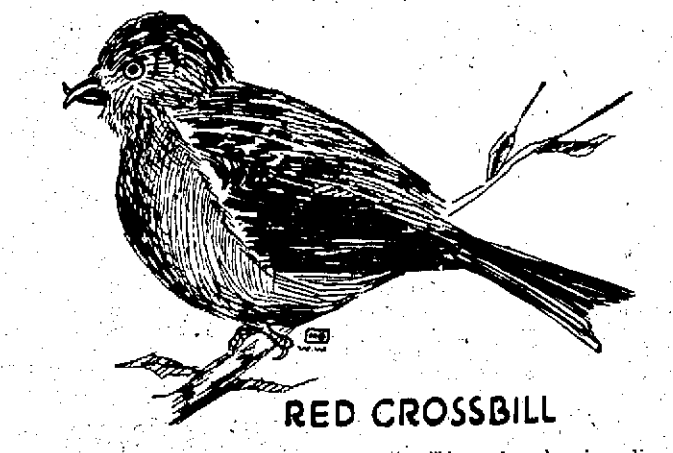

# Who's Who Among Wisconsin Birds



**RED CROSSBILL**

The Red Crossbill as found in Wisconsin has the mandibles of its beak crossed which adapts the bird to extract seeds from evergreen cones.

It is a permanent resident in the evergreen forests of the northern part of the state where it nests. It may wander southward in the fall, winter and spring and occasionally appears in the summer months far south of its breeding range.

Its nesting range takes in the coniferous forests from central Alaska, northern Mackenzie and central Quebec south to northern Minnesota, northern Wisconsin and northern Michigan. In winter it wanders irregularly southward to northern Texas, Louisiana and Florida.

The adult male is dull red with brownish wings and
