Kunes And Nelson Tie For Lead In Miami Open Meet

MIAMI, Fla., Dec. 16.—(AP)—National Open Champion Byron Nelson fighting an uphill battle for the nation's golfing supremacy, shared the lead with a dark horse today as a sensational scoring field reached the third round of the \$10,000 Miami open.

Little-known Gene Kunes of Philadelphia came out of yesterday's twilight shadows with a sparkling 66 to tie Nelson at 137 at the half-way mark. The national open king's chief rival, Henry Picard, was three strokes back.

Nelson not only had a chance to overcome Picard's five-point advantage and win the Harry Vardon trophy, but a revised tabulation gave him a shot as top money winner. The corrected money standing gave Nelson \$8,844, Picard \$10,202.

Kunes got no attention at all with his first round 71, when Nelson and seven others shot 68's, but he turned the tournament into a madhouse with his four-under-par 66, the best score to date. Machine-like from tee to green, the Philadelphian, who operates a winter proving range at Hollywood, Fla., accounted for five birdies and bogeyed only one hole.

WHEAT PRICES SHOOT HIGHER

Serious Deterioration Officially Reported In Argentina Crop
CHICAGO, Dec. 16.—(AP)—Wheat prices shot up more than a cent a bushel in early trading today to new high levels that had not been reached since the fall of 1937.

The official Argentine crop report estimating wheat production at only 148,000,000 bushels compared with 336,000,000 produced last year confirmed recent reports of serious deterioration. However, it was not as low as some private estimates.

Opening 5-8 - 1-3-8 higher, December 1.05, May 1.02 1-4 - 3-4. Chicago wheat later held near this range. Corn started 1-8 - 3-8 up, December 57 7-8 - 3-4, May 57 1-8 - 1-4.

First, Lou Nova got himself knocked out by Tony Galento and last night, the fabulous Patrick Edward Comiskey of Paterson, N. J., was plastered by Steve Dudas, a never-was, before an inebriated crowd in Madison Square Garden.

Pat is the golden-haired boy who, up to last evening, had knocked out 22 of 24 opponents and was being heralded the "champion of 1941." His manager practically had accepted an elimination bout with Lou Nova for next March. Dudas, who rates only as a tough trial horse, gave a surprisingly good performance in winning his decision.

Sky Blazers Will Present Man Who Made First "Loop"

Howard Rinehart Will Tell Of Performing Daring "Outside" Circle And Of Adventures In Hunt For Black Diamonds
The thrilling exploits of Howard Rinehart, who flitted with death as the first pilot ever to maneuver his plane through a dangerous "outside loop," will be dramatized on the second Sky Blazers broadcast, Saturday over WABC, 7:30 p. m.

Sky Blazers will reveal how Rinehart, who received his first flying instructions from Orville Wright, later became one of the foremost teachers of flying as the chief instructor of the Orville Wright Aviation school.

The story of his search for black diamonds along a little-known tributary of the great Amazon river, is given in an exciting dramatized sequence. Rinehart and his party were captured by head-hunters after struggling for months against the dangers of the jungle fastness.
