FINALLY GETS DIVORCE

She charged her husband with being domineering and jealous.

SOIL FUMIGATION RECOMMENDED TO INCREASE YIELD

COLUMBUS, O., Dec. 30.—(INS)—Tripling or even quadrupling the yield of farm lands thru soil fumigation was a possibility advanced today at the 105th annual convention of the American Association for the Advancement of Science.

Thru the use of tear gas—"chloropicrin"—two horticulturists of the Rhode Island agricultural experiment station, Drs. Frank L. Howard and Fred K. Crandall, reported the normal yield of tomatoes increased as much as 378 per cent.

Soil fumigation at the rate of 200 pounds of chloropicrin to the acre increased the yield of No. 1 tomatoes 132 per cent in 1937; 378 per cent in 1938, and 246 per cent in 1939, the scientists reported. They also declared that the leaves exhibited less disease and the roots showed less injury from soil organisms in the treated areas.

They found, however, that an annual application was necessary since only slight benefits were evident the second season.

"But even at present prices the treatment appears profitable," they declared.

The ripening date of the fruit was not affected, the report stated.

At the fourth general session of the AAAA, Dr. Julian S. Huxley, world-famed English biologist and traveler, declared that a "United States of Europe" must be established if that continent is to have lasting peace.

Speaking of "science, war and religion," Dr. Huxley warned that the war was bound to be followed by "radical changes in the structure of society and the organization of the world."

"At the end of the war the world will face a task for which it is ill prepared," he stated. "It is urgent that every country—perhaps most of all those not imperiled in the struggle—should begin to think out the plan of the new world."

A "League of Nations" would not serve the purpose, Dr. Huxley emphasized.

SEIZED AFTER TOLEDO BATTLE

TOLEDO, O., Dec. 30.—(AP)—James Dailey, 53, a Sylvania, O. high school bus driver was shot and several Toledo gasoline service stations held up by two youths who went on a brief but spectacular crime outburst last night.

The bandits were captured by Lucas-co deputy sheriffs after a running gun battle in which an 85-mile-an-hour speed was reached. The chase ended when the stolen car used by the suspects crashed into a shop. The suspects, who gave the names of Henry Jones and Roy Stevens, have admitted shooting Dailey and the three service station robberies. Deputy William Lewland said Dailey, shot in the leg and chest, is in Toledo hospital. His condition is not critical.
