

Butler walked in with a copy of the resolution which took away his powers. He handed the resolution to Stahl. Then, police said, there was the report of a pistol and Stahl, who had grabbed at Butler, groaned

and collapsed, a bullet in his left

Allen Knudson, a councilman, and Max Zerbin, newly elected mayor, seized the revolver from Butler, who then left Stahl's office and went to his own, which adjoins it. Peliceman Ruscansky entered Butler's office just as the treasurer was drawing a .38 calibre revolver from a desk drawer. He fired at the officer, wounding him in the abdomen.
