Lowe Trial Recessed After G-Man Testifies

Trial of Fred O. Lowe in federal court was recessed for the weekend Friday after Richard B. Smith, special investigator of the Federal Bureau of Identification, had completed direct testimony. Smith, an accountant, presented a detailed chart analysis of alleged "check kiting" transactions by Lowe, a cattle buyer of Soldiers Grove, and Oscar Heibach, discharged manager of a Lynxville banking station. The government plans to rest its case against Lowe after cross-examination of Smith is completed, Asst. U. S. Atty. Alvin Loverud said today.

Man Held to Face Charge Under Dyer Act Chester Andrews, 35, who recently completed a year's sentence in Waupun prison for carrying concealed weapons, was brought to Madison from Milwaukee Friday to face a federal charge of violating the Dyer act. Andrews is charged with having transported a stolen auto on Jan. 7, 1939, from Duluth to Ashland county. He was held in the Dane county jail pending removal to Superior for trial. Andrews has denied theft of the car, said U. S. Atty. John J. Boyle.

51 Deny Milk Price Charge CHICAGO—(U.P.)—Fifty-five defendants associated in the milk industry pleaded not guilty Friday in federal court to charges of conspiring to fix milk prices in violation of the Sherman anti-trust act. The defendants are corporations, police, health officials and labor unions.
