

Policy In Pacific Will Be Discussed At Town Meeting

Paul V. McNutt And Nicholas Roosevelt To Air Views During Broadcast Starting At 9:30 P. M. Thursday

Two former officials of the nation's Pacific outpost will discuss the question "Should We Stay in the Philippines?" during "America's Town Meeting of the Air," on Thursday, at 9:30 p. m., over WJZ.

Paul V. McNutt, newly appointed Federal Securities administrator and former high commissioner to the Philippines and Nicholas Roosevelt, once vice-governor of the Islands, and now of the N Y Herald-Tribune editorial staff, will be the speakers.

Raymond Leslie Buell, editor of the Fortune Round Table will be heard as interrogator and commentator during the informal portion of the program. George V. Denny, Jr., will be moderator.
