The secrecy brought a flock of new rumors. Most prevalent one was that the picture would end with the Joad family, presumably at the end of an arduous pilgrimage, standing on a mountain road and joyfully looking at the Promised Land to the west. By any standards, this would have been an outraceous betrayal of a great story-a great story whether it is good, had, right or wrong.

So the grunblings against Hollywood increased. There were accounts of how Author Steinbeck had deposited his \$70,000 check in a reserve account to sue the studio for the mistreatment of his novel.

But from the set liself leaked reports that the picture actually was being done in the spirit and substance of the book. Immediately came rumors of the bitter disapproval of the Okies, and of threats of reprisal against Hollywood by the powerful community and moneyed interests of California.

So nobody knew what the score was until the press preview the other day.

#### . . . PREVIEWERS AMAZED BY SINCERITY OF FILM

We were all astonished by the courage, integrity and sincerity of transcription to celluloid ot "The Grapes of Wrath." I am ashamed to say that we were not all pleased, I heard comments around the projection room that Zanuck is a fool to make such a picture, and that he is inviting a sterner cracking down of censorship which would harm the whole industry.

I believe that Zanuck is, as usual, as smart as 47 foxes. His picture is propaganda; and yet, I cannot feel that it reflects to the discredit of the people of Oklahoma or California. Philosophically or acoially, it represents nothing more than a condition. As such, it is a picture so powerful that it thumbs its nose at intolerance and challenges the forces which have been so impotent against the published novel or the spoken play.

All things considered, "The Grapes of Wrath" is the best picture I've ever seen in my life.




