

Louis-Godoy Title Scrap To Be Broadcast Friday Night

Heavyweight Battle Will Hit Airwaves At 10 P. M. With Sam Taub And Bill Stern Describing Encounter

Joe Louis 15-round defense of his world's heavyweight crown against Arturo Godoy, at Madison Square Garden on Friday, will be described over the nationwide WJZ network beginning at 10:00 p. m. The encounter will be described in detail by Sam Taub and Bill Stern.

Barry Fitzgerald and Sara Allgood, members of the original Abbey Players who presented Shean O'Casey's "Juno and the Paycock" in Dublin in 1924, will broadcast scenes from its current Broadway revival on the "Kate Smith Hour" Friday at 8:00 p. m. over WABC.

In the musical portion of the program Ted Collins will introduce Kate Smith in such popular hits as "All the Things You Are," "This Changing World" and "Wind At My Window." The Ted Straker Singers will offer a unique rhythm arrangement of "Smooty Plants," Abbott and Costello, Paiker Fenelly and Arthur Allen in a "Snow Village Sketch" and Jack Miller's music will round out the program of song, drama and comedy.

"The Fatal Error," starring those forceful characters, Inspector Ross and Step-Down Donovan, is Max Marcin's "Perfect Crime" dramatization on "Johnny Presents" over WABC Friday at 9 p. m. Music, conducted by Johnny Green, includes "To You Sweetheart, Aloha," "I'm Sorry Dear," "Holy Smoke" and "Careless" and "I've Got My Eyes On You."

The Electronic Orchestra, which last year made musical history on the air by pioneering the electronic music, will again make music with molecules on Friday in a return engagement over WEAF at 10:00 p. m.

The orchestra, now with several new instruments and an increased personnel, will again be under the baton of Andrew Moriarty, well-known dance band conductor. GIRL QUIZZED ON KIDNAPING CASE CHARGES

(From News Bureau) OTTAWA, Feb. 9.—The story of Lois Gould, 12-year-old girl who was taken from her home in Cloverdale, west of here, Jan. 27, by Mrs. Helen Austin of Haskins, was reviewed yesterday by Prosecuting Attorney F. E. Warren of Putnam-co in connection with kidnaping charges filed against Mrs. Austin by Walter Gould, the child's father.

Details of the information obtained from the child were not divulged but the prosecutor indicated that her story corroborated for the most part information given the authorities by the father. Mrs. Austin is being held in the Putnam-co jail in default of \$5,000 bond. She pleaded not guilty to the charge of kidnaping for immoral purposes which Gould placed against her. The woman was housekeeper in the Gould home for three months before she left with the child.
