

Today's Radio Highlights

From the White House, President Roosevelt addresses the members of the American Youth Congress and the young people of the United States—WOL, WRC, WMAL and WJSV, 12:30 p. m.

Puccini's "La Boheme" is broadcast from the Metropolitan Opera House. Singing the role of Mimi is Bidu Sayao, Brazilian soprano. Others in the cast are Giuseppe de Luca, barytone, as Marcello; Ezio Pinza, bass, as Colline; Armand Tokatyan, tenor, as Rodolfo. "La Boheme" was first produced in Turin in 1898 and was adapted from Muerger's novel, "Vie de Boheme"—WMAL, 1:55 p. m.

The Right Rev. Msgr. Fulton J. Sheen, associate professor of philosophy at Catholic University, will address the Youth of America on the "Call to Youth" program, sponsored by the National Council of Catholic Women—WRC, 2 p. m.

A series of four programs of contemporary American music by eminent composers from all sections of the country is inaugurated today with selections by the Stradivarius Quartet and Composers Arthur Roberts and Raphael Silverman, in a broadcast from Boston—WJSV, 4 p. m.

Mr. Lynn C. Drake, president of the Washington Boy Scouts, interviews a group of scouts who appeared at the New York World's Fair as a special feature of the Boy Scout thirtieth anniversary of scouting—WOL, 5:15 p. m.

Federal Security Administrator Paul V. McNutt, Col. Theodore Roosevelt, and Rear Admiral Reginal R. Belknap, U. S. Navy, retired, will discuss problems related to national defense, on the "People's Platform" program—WJSV, 7:30 p. m.

Bruno Walter, internationally famous conductor-pianist, will conduct the N. B. C. Symphony Orchestra in the first of a series of five weekly concerts. Walter, last of three distinguished guest conductors heard during Arturo Toscanini's absence from the N. B. C. Symphony podium, has chosen Bruckner's "Romantic" Symphony No. 4, in E-Flat Major, and Haydn's Symphony No. 86, in D Major, for his opening concert—WMAL, 10 p. m.
