

Hour-Long Vatican City Broadcast to Open Easter Sunday Radio Schedule

Good Friday, Easter Programs Featured on Radio Tonight

Music of the Easter season will predominate in radio programs tonight, and three will be devoted to Good Friday observances.

At 9, WIBA and WENR will broadcast a Good Friday service with the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Fulton J. Sheen speaking on "The Last Word" and with music by the Paulist chorists.

The choir of All Angels church, New York City, will sing portions of Brahms' "German" requiem through WIND at 10:30, and WENR will broadcast the Philadelphia orchestra's recordings of the prelude and "Good Friday Spell" from "Parsifal" at midnight.

Pius' Blessing and Opera on WBBM at 5 A. M.

From 5 a. m., when the voice of Pope Pius XII will be heard, until after midnight, radio will join the rest of Christendom in celebrating Easter.

In an hour-long broadcast, WBBM listeners will hear the pontiff bless throngs in St. Peter's square, descriptions of the sacred ceremonies, and Vatican choir sing centuries-old hymns.

Radio Service Interviews Set for April

Radio servicemen applying for licenses under the new ordinance passed by the common council, will be interviewed by the board of electrical examiners in the building commissioner's office in the city hall Monday, April 1, at 7 p. m., E. M. Michelson, electrical inspector, announced today.

Applicants submitting affidavits for licenses must have the same on file in the building commissioner's office not later than March 30, Michelson said. Those desiring to take the written exams must have their applications on file not later than April 19.
