

Don Budge And Crosby Will Engage In Battle Of Words

Virginia Bruce, Ann Jameson To Also Be Heard With Bing; Janitor-Waiter Set To Be Soloist With Paige

Donald Budge, the tennis player who turned "pro" when he ran out of competition in the amateur ranks, will be on the other side of the microphone when Bing Crosby steps forward for a battle of words in the Music Hall Thursday.

Regular "checkers-in" for the weekly variety hour besides Bing include Bob Burns, the Music Mads, and John Scott Trotter's orchestra.

A Boston team janitor and waiter who studies trumpet when not toting trays or heaving coal, will be soloist with Raymond Paige and the orchestra—100 Men of Melody, on "The Musical Americana" broadcast, Thursday, at 8:00 p. m., over WJZ.

It will be a case of "home town boy makes good," for Harry Best Herforth, the tray-toting trumpeter, is a native of Pittsburgh. He will be interviewed by Deems Taylor, eminent composer-critic starred as master of ceremonies on Musical Americana, which Kenneth L. Watt produces and directs. Milton Cross is the announcer.

For his Musical Americana appearance, Herforth has chosen Goeyens' "Introduction et Scherzo" in his own arrangement for full orchestra. NOISE OF TYRANNOSAURUS, HARVARD GIVES ANSWER
BOSTON, April 4—(UP)—A Boston university professor has given Hollywood an answer to its problem of what noises a Tyrannosaurus and Dimetrodon made when they roamed the earth in prehistoric times.

Producer Hal Roach asked for the information in connection with a picture he is making. Prof. James R. Martin of the geology department suggests that the noise of the mud-turtle and alligator be magnified for the picture.

He says that the vocal organs of prehistoric monsters did not fossilize when their skeletons did and that it is therefore impossible to determine what sounds the animals would make. He says, however, that mud-turtles, snakes and alligators are the nearest approach to Tyrannosaurus and Dimetrodon in our civilization.

MacMurray suddenly returns one husband too many! The unique comedy situation, Jean's inability to explain her changed marital status to her own husband, the determined effort made by the two husbands to decide who shall rise gracefully from the scene, the intense courtship which both men pay to their previously lonely wife, Fred's efforts to emulate Melvyn and Melvyn's efforts to emulate Fred—make of "Too Many Husbands" a picture in a thousand.

Hollywood has made a jungle picture in which the jungle is not the star, but rather the background for magnificent acting. It is a story of seven men and one woman pitted against nature and, at times, even against each other. That's "Green Hell," now Douglas Fairbanks, Jr., Joan Bennett picture, now at the Sigma theatre.
