

Cutter Of Jonker Diamond On "Strange As It Seems"

Reenactment Of Buffalo Bill's Ride Also Scheduled; New Vocal Stock Company To Make Debut

Lazare Kaplan, the gem wizard who dared to split the famed Jonker diamond, even tho he knew that the slightest miscalculation in the delicate operation would destroy the stone and cost its owners \$1,000,000, will be interviewed by Alois Havrilla on the Strange As It Seems program, Thursday over WABC at 8:30 p. m.

Another feature on the broadcast will be a reenactment of Buffalo Bill's history making ride for the Pony Express. Just "Young Bill Cody," a 15-year-old shaver, Buffalo Bill persuaded a Pony Express official in Red Butte, Neb., to let him take the place of an injured rider.

How his ride, which was to have ended at the next relay station, turned out to be the longest one man ride in the whole history of the Pony Express, will be revealed on the program.

A new "vocal stock company" chosen from hundreds of applicants in the Pittsburgh metropolitan area, will make its debut on Musical Americana, Thursday at 8:00 p. m. over WJZ under the direction of Raymond Paige, conductor of the Westinghouse Radio Orchestra—100 men of Melody.

The guest student soloist will be Kathleen Thompson, graduate student of viola at Oberlin Conservatory of Music. She will play "At Dawning" by Charles Wakefield Lapworth and "The Inland Sea" by Deems Taylor and Raymond Paige.

Miriam Hopkins will try a Southern accent on the banks of the Avon, in the role of Ann Hathaway.

The good, tho slightly aged, Queen Bess, will be played by Margaret Hamilton, lately seen as the witch in the film, "The Wizard of Oz." Slapsie Maxie Rosenberg, who still thinks that Avon was the bangtail on which Stratford sunk his bankroll will stand by to protect Vallee from the Queen's English.

Linda Darnell Has Good Cast As Support In "Star Dust"

Indian Film Is Due At State With Rooney Picture Still At Ohio; Double Feature Offered At Sigma

Beautiful, exciting Linda Darnell lives a story that might be a chapter out of her own meteoric rise to stardom in "Star Dust," which commences Friday evening at the Quilna preview. The lovely Dallas, Tex., girl is supported by a great cast, headed by handsome John Payne, Roland Young and Charlotte Greenwood.

Also scheduled to start Friday night is "The Man Who Wouldn't Talk," with glamorous Dorothy LaMour and Lloyd Nolan. "Too Many Husbands," a rollicking comedy, ends Friday afternoon.

Opening Thursday at the State is "Allegheeny Uprising" a stirring tale of the period when savage Indians ravaged the eastern section of the country. Lovely Claire Trevor and John Wayne have leading roles and are supported by George Sanders, Brian Donlevy and Wilfrid Lawson.

Completing the program is "The Mad Express," a love story with Lionel Atwill and Conrad Nagel.

Thursday and Friday will be the final day for the showing of "Young Tom Edison," on the Ohio theatre screen. The story, which tells the early life of America's greatest inventor, has Mickey Rooney as Edison. Fay Bainter portrays his mother and others in the cast are Virginia Weidler, George Bancroft and Eugene Pallette.

How the daring cattle thieves of 60 years ago operated is disclosed in "Bullet Code," at the Sigma theatre starring George O'Brien.

The Sigma also has "The Man From Dakota," a fast-action drama of a Yankee prisoner of war. John Howard, Wallace Beery and Dolores Del Rio are featured.

At the Lyric theatre is "Chasing Trouble," the story of an adventurous florist's delivery boy who tries to solve crime by analyzing handwriting. Also on the program is "Young Buffalo Bill," with Roy Rogers, George Hayes and Chief Thunder Cloud.

That Thomas Alva Edison, America's greatest inventor, was certainly no lump of sugar in his youth is revealed to the public not familiar with his boyhood in "Young Tom Edison," starring Mickey Rooney as Tom, at the Ohio theatre. In fact, the picture

will show that the kindly Wizard of Menlo Park was Andy Hardy, Tom Sawyer and one or two of the Dead End Kids all rolled into one.

A dozen or more of Edison's outstanding boyhood pranks are perpetrated by Mickey Rooney. Each of them was achieved by Tom at one time or another in his youth, but for story purposes they have been concentrated into the span of his life with which the picture deals.

One of Edison's most amusing pranks in the picture is when he feeds Bobby Jordan a half-dozen seidlitz powders, telling him that the gas thus generated in his stomach will enable him to fly. Young Tom actually did that trick on a boy, but he did it seriously as an experiment.

A scene in which young Tom helps his sister, Tannie, in a geography lesson at school by tapping out the names of states in Morse code with a pencil, was an actual happening for which Edison was punished.

But Edison, the boy, is painted exactly as he was—an experimenting young rascal whose exploits brought upon him the verdict of a schoolteacher that he was "addled."

Prominent in support of Rooney in the production are Fay Bainter and George Bancroft as his respective mother and father, Virginia Weidler as his young sister, Eugene Pallette, Victor Kilian, Bobbie Jordan, J. M. Kerrigan, Lloyd Corrigan, John Kellogg, Clem Bevans, Lily Malvon and Harry Shannon.

A typically actino-filled comedy-heavy performance by Wallace Beery, a sparkling return to the screen by Dolores Del Rio and a stalwart and convincing characterization by leading-man John Howard combine to provide thrilling entertainment in "The Man From Dakota," Civil war story at the Sigma theatre.

Picturization of an historic novel by MacKinlay Kantor, the narrative gives Beery opportunity for all of his familiar and enjoyable antics as a Yankee prisoner of war who escapes the Confederate prison at Belle Isle, and with his young and idealistic superior officer, portrayed by Howard, sets out to find a haven, preferably far out West, the Howard is determined to find the Union lines. As a Russian girl who also becomes a fugitive and must throw in her lot with Beery and Howard after she kills a Confederate officer, Miss Del Rio has a role which gives her fine and emotional possibilities which she more than lives up to.

The supporting cast is headed by a list of noted character actors, among them Donald Meek as the cringing and unscrupulous Vestry.
