MIAMI — (U.P.) — A young husband and wife, who sailed recently for a tiny Bahaman isle with 17 others in search of a perfect existence, returned here today and were so glad to be back that he kissed the ground three times as soon as they stepped ashore.

Ernest A. Lawrence, 25, and his wife, Cecilia, 28, of San Francisco, who had spent more than a month on East Caicos, the British West Indies isle where the group had hoped to establish a Utopia, declined to discuss the venture, but they obviously were happy to return. Asked whether they ever expected to go back to East Caicos, Lawrence replied: "Maybe in six years," and his wife said: "Never."

R. C. Irvine, former Pasadena (Cal.) toy manufacturer who headed the group, his wife, their four children, and Edward Read, 18, Irvine's ward, have left the island and are on their way back here, Lawrence said, leaving 10 of the colonists on East Caicos.

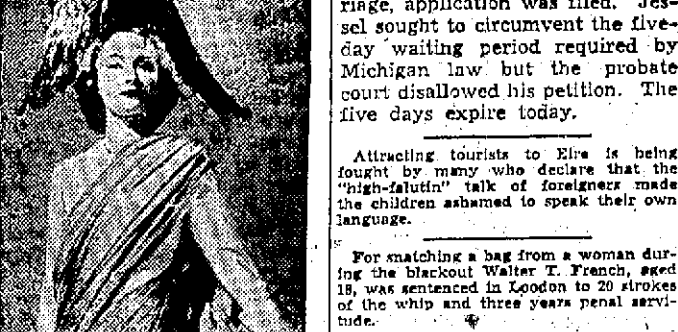
