## WBBM to Salute 1940 Baseball Season; First Games on Air Tuesday

**UNCLE RAY'S CORNER** By Uncle Ray

Among the world's rivers, the Congo ranks high. It is close to 3,000 miles long, and drains an area of more than a million square miles. Only one river—the Amazon, pours more water into the ocean than the Congo.

The Congo rises in the heart of Africa, and flows northward for a distance of about 1,200 miles. Then it turns west and runs toward the Atlantic. Dozens of streams and rivers, some of them of large size, join the Congo on its way to the ocean.

The mighty river winds through the Belgian Congo, which is larger than France, Spain, Italy and Germany put together. Think of a little country like Belgium owning such a big colony.

The Belgian Congo is of great size, but it is not thickly settled. It contains only about one-fourth as many people as live in France. The number of people per square mile is about 11.

That, of course, is a general average. The people are not spread out evenly. Thousands of square miles have no people at all, while other parts have villages or cities. The largest Congo city has 26,000 people.

At the mouth of the Congo is a town with an odd name. It is called "Banana," and serves as a seaport.

It is figured that the Congo river pours about 1,200,000 cubic feet of water into the Atlantic each second of the day. The amount of water it empties in a day would make a lake two miles wide and four miles long, with an average depth of 464 feet.

Ocean steamers can travel into the Congo river and upstream for a distance of 110 miles. Then they meet rapids. It is possible for some steamers to travel on the water above the rapids, but the river is not deep enough there for the larger ocean-going vessels.

On a trip from one end of the Congo to the other, a person might pass hundreds of boats used by natives. These often are little more than logs which have been hollowed out.
