The European situation, which caused much uneasiness in the trade, prompted dealers who were short to even up accounts for over the week-end, which helped to give the market a lift.

Wheat reacted slightly from the highs but closed 1/4 to 1 cent higher than yesterday, May \$1.08 1/2 to 3/8, July \$1.07 to 1.06 7/8; corn 1-2 to 1 cent up, May 64 3/8 to 1-2, July 65 1/8 to 1-4; oats 5/8 to 3/4 higher.
