STATE AGREES TO SHARE COST OF NEW BRIDGE

(Special To The Lima News) VAN WERT, May 1—After years of dickering among county, city and state highway officials, it appears that a new bridge will be constructed over Town Creek on S. Washington-st in this city. Financing of the project has been passed off by officials for years.

It was announced Tuesday by the State Highway Department that bids for the construction of a concrete bridge will be received at Columbus on May 17 until 10 a. m. The estimated cost is \$26,072.15. It has been agreed that the city will pay \$2,000, the county \$5,500 and the state the remainder.

The bridge is to be of concrete rigid-frame type with a 40-foot span and 46-foot roadway plus two six-foot three-inch sidewalks. Work on the span will be started immediately following the peony festival on June 5.
