CONSIDER WHAT'S LEFT ALONG IN the play of the hand, suppose one defender has already shown a good deal of high card strength, such as, perhaps, an ace-king. If he made no bid of any kind during the auction, it is quite likely that he has no more high-card strength. Whatever other important honors are out of sight are probably in his partner's hand. If you figure it out that way, you will do well to plan the remainder of the play on that assumption.
