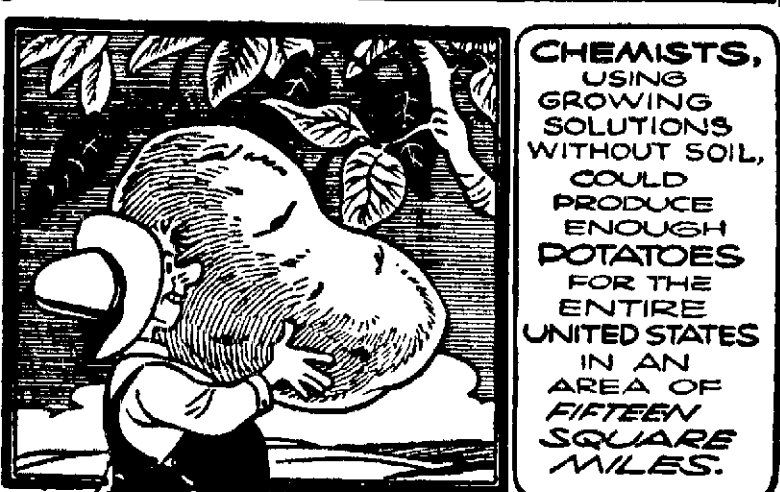

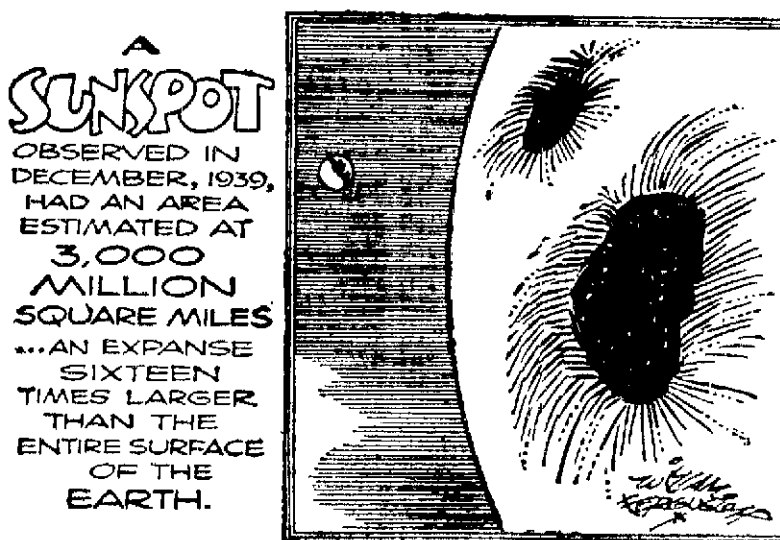

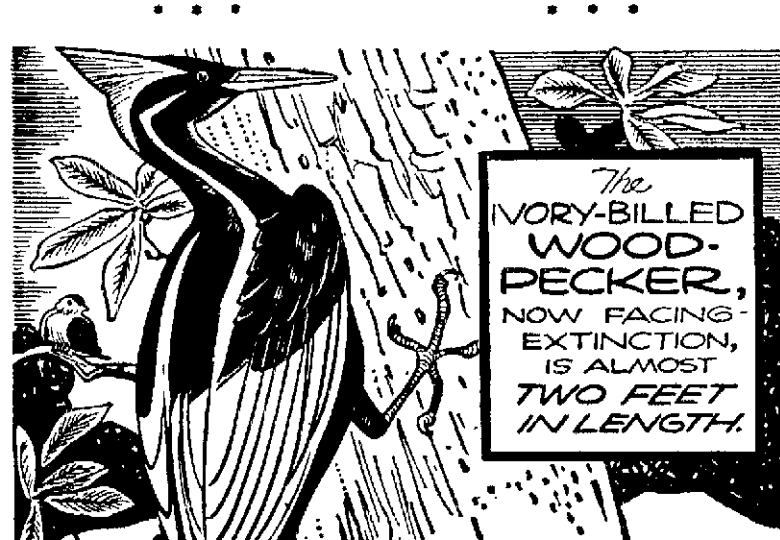

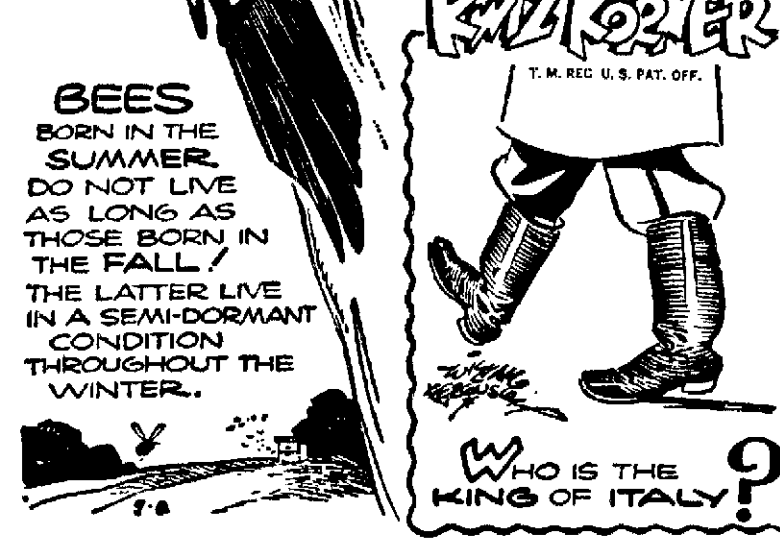

"Swiss Family Robinson" To Open Sigma Run Wednesday

Sextet Of Brilliant Players In Cast Of New Hit; "The Saint's Double Trouble" Second Film On Bill

A sextet of brilliant players, Thomas Mitchell, Edna Best, Freddie Bartholomew, Terry Kilburn, Tim Holt and Baby Bobby Quillan, play the featured roles in "Swiss Family Robinson," opening Wednesday at the Sigma theatre. Also on the program is "The Saint's Double Trouble," another of the adventures of the popular character, with George Sanders and Helene Whitney in the featured roles.

The motion picture version of the celebrated John Steinbeck novel, "Grapes of Wrath," is the current Lyric attraction. With an all-star cast including Henry Fonda, Jane Darwell, John Carradine and Charley Grapewin, the story realistically reveals the plight of the dust bowl victims, the "Okies."

A stirring and memorable romance of a young couple who didn't know how to hold their happiness, is brilliantly told in "Primrose Path," at the Ohio theatre, with Ginger Rogers and Joel McCrea starred. Others in the cast include Marjorie Rambeau, Queenie Vassar, Henry Travers, Miles Mander and little Joan Carroll.

The popular color cartoon, "Gulliver's Travels," heads the State double attraction, with the famous sailor's adventures in the land of the Lilliputians entertainingly told in song and story. Also showing is "The Big Guy," starring Victor McLaglen and Jackie Cooper in the story of a dilemma that a prison warden finds himself when he learns of a prisoner's innocence which he can prove only at a loss to himself.

Telling in absorbing fashion its romantic tale of two young people who fall in love without understanding its power, "Primrose Path," co-stars Ginger Rogers and Joel McCrea in what is said to be one of the year's most dynamic and realistic dramas at the Ohio.

The picture has its locale in a little California seacoast town where McCrea runs a hamburger stand near the cannery and Ginger is the older daughter of a completely disreputable family.

The pair falls in love almost on first sight and Ginger marries him, hoping he will never find out what her family is like. But inevitably he does find out, and in disgust tells Ginger he never wants to see her again. The stirring results, influenced by family disrepute and jealousy and the stubborn pride of both the young principals make for the compelling suspense and drama of the story.

As the fearless little outcast, Ginger has by far the most powerful role of her career. It is a role spiced with humor and swift repartee, giving her unlimited opportunity to display her histrionic talents. McCrea's part also is ideal for the rugged young star, and the pair is supported by a notable hand-picked cast of favorites.

Marjorie Rambeau and Miles Mander enact the roles of Ginger's parents, with Henry Travers as McCrea's kindly grandfather, and Queenie Vassar, noted musical comedy star of the nineties, making her screen debut as Ginger's araspish grandmother. Little Joan Carroll, Vivienne Osborne and Carmen Morales have other important roles.

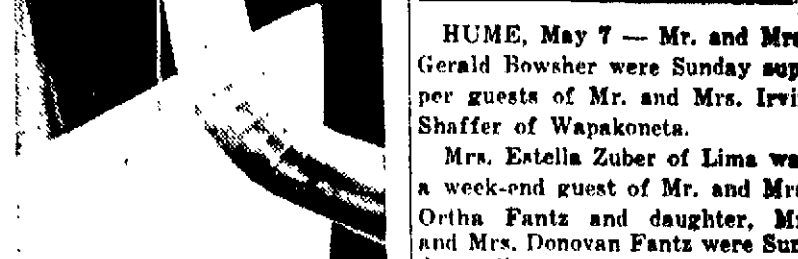

In the South Seas a storm wrecks their vessel. Only the Robinsons survive. When the waves subside they build a raft, ferry themselves and some livestock, tools and clothing to a near-by island, a tropical paradise alive with gay colored birds and strange animals.
