QUEEN WILHELMINA ASKS CALMNESS AND DEVOTION; PLEDGES TO DO HER DUTY

THE HAGUE, May 10—(INS)—Queen Wilhelmina of the Netherlands today addressed a proclamation to the nation over the official Dutch radio appealing for "calm and devotion" in Holland's crisis. "I and my government will do our duty," she said. "German armed forces, without the slightest warning, made a sudden attack upon our territory last night despite a solemn promise that our neutrality would be respected. I hereby address a burning protest against this unexampled breach of good faith and disregard of decency between civilized nations. I appeal to you everywhere and in all circumstances that each of you wherever stationed will with utmost vigilance, calm and devotion do your duty to the state."
