# MRS. TAFT IS ENJOYING HER TASK OF ASSISTING IN HUSBAND'S CAMPAIGN

WASHINGTON, May 14—(AP)—Mrs. Martha B. Taft isn't disappointed in her job of assisting in her husband's campaign for the Republican presidential nomination.

Since Sen. Robert A. Taft entered the contest, Mrs. Taft has traveled to most sections of the country, either in company with her husband or on campaign trips of her own—the latter aimed at enlisting the support of women voters.

Mrs. Taft, obviously enjoying her self-imposed job, has arranged a solo journey this week to the west coast for speeches before Republican women's groups in several states.

This follows speaking trips in New England and eastern seaboard states.

Rep. Kiwan of Youngstown hopes for action before adjournment of congress on a new plan for construction of a navigable canal thru the great industrial area of eastern Ohio.

Kirwan introduced a bill (HR-9721) to create a federal waterway authority to build and operate such a canal from Beaver, Pa., on the Ohio river, to a point 21 miles up the Beaver river in the vicinity of New Castle, thence up the Mahoning River about 12 miles to Struthers, Ohio.

There was no hint meanwhile that congress would consider in the near future a long-pending proposal to build a \$200,000,000 canal from the Ohio river to Lake Erie.

Kirwan's bill would authorize establishment of a Beaver-Mahoning rivers authority which would issue and sell its own obligations to finance construction and acquisition of property.

The authority would be administered by three directors appointed by the President. One director would represent the public, one the industries of the Mahoning valley, and the other the war department engineers.

While the legislation made no estimate of the development, it stipulated that the authority would be authorized to issue and sell a maximum of \$50,000,000 of 100-year first mortgage bonds with an interest rate of 3 1/4 per cent a year.

The bonds would not be guaranteed by the federal government, but construction and supervision would be controlled by the war department.

To amortize the debt, the authority would be authorized to charge tolls on traffic.

Upon debt maturity, the canal would be toll free and the authority dissolved. In the event of war, the jurisdiction of the authority and its obligations could be assumed by the war department or any department designated by the President.

Rep. Jenkins of Ironton thinks congress should curb the powers of conference committees.

These committees, composed of senators and representatives, are appointed to adjust controversies.

Arrangements were incomplete today but Lammers predicted that practically every county in the district would be represented. Vocational agriculture judging contests will make up part of the program and efforts are being made to have a representative from the Swiss embassy in Washington, D. C. make the principal address.

C. L. Blackman, animal husbandry specialist of Ohio State university, will be the judge for the livestock show.

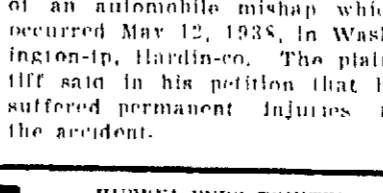
