Raymond Massey, renowned stage and screen actor, who evoked unanimous praise for his interpretation of the title role when the play was first produced on the stage, repeats his deft characterization in this film.

While the character of Abraham Lincoln has been the principal figure in scores of stage and screen offerings, experts on Lincoln history admit the character has been grossly exaggerated and distorted under exercise of dramatic license.

The screen version is said to utilize the wider sweep of the movie medium to add illuminating bits that were impractical on the stage, but otherwise adheres closely to the plot and action of the sensational Broadway hit.

The story of "Abe Lincoln in Illinois" records the formative years of Lincoln's life between his arrival in Illinois at the age of 21, and his election to the presidency 30 years later. Compressed within this vital period are probably the most inspiring events in Lincoln's career, for it was during those years that the man emerged from a melancholy, moody, erratic individual into a forceful, determined, resourceful statesman, who, altho he devoted public attention, resolved to fulfill his apparent destiny to lead his country along the path of true democracy.
