Ted Lewis Bringing Revue To The Ohio Stage Saturday

Famous Showman's All New Production Booked For One Day Only: "Abe Lincoln In Illinois" To Close Friday

The famous comedian of the clarinet and top hat, Ted Lewis, will bring his new stage production, "Happiness Revue," to the Ohio theatre stage Saturday.

Mystery, comedy and romance have shares in the two hits now at the Lyric. "Man From Montreal," featuring Richard Arlen, in a story of a young trapper in the rich fur

country who is unjustly arrested and charged with murder and fur thefts. Completing the bill is "Son of the Navy," a rollicking comedy with Jean Parker and James Dunn.

Drama and romance behind the forbidding walls of the big house highlight the thrilling picture, "Women Without Names," at the Sigma. Robert Paige and Ellen Drew have principal roles.

A great prison story is "Castle on the Hudson," which opened Thursday at the State for a three-day run. Lovely Ann Sheridan and John Garfield have leading roles.

Shattering the stuffy traditions and false auras that have hung around the conventional picture of our " martyred President" of the Civil war era, the screen version of "Abe Lincoln in Illinois" now at the Ohio, bravely reveals Lincoln as he really was, as a man, and not as a demigod.

The picture covers some thirty years of Lincoln's life during its formative stages; and it achieves an amazing force and conviction that makes it truly one of the screen's finest offerings.

The story opens with his arrival as a tall, awkward youngster of twenty-one in the wilderness that was Illinois, and it ends with his departure for Washington to take up the fateful burden of the presidency in the face of the oncoming Civil war.

Between these two episodes the picture manages to build up an extraordinarily realistic portrait of his much-misunderstood central figure, presenting the various stages of his growth from a hesitant, shy, self-conscious and undecided youth to the resolute man who said farewell to his friends that March evening in the Springfield railway station.

Lincoln's tragic romance with Ann Rutledge, his stormy engagement and eventual marriage to Mary Todd, the inner conflicts between his timidity and his strength, which made him so incomprehensible to his contemporaries, these all are woven with absorbing effect into the pattern of the portrayal that Raymond Massey gives in the title role.

The supporting players, too, are ideally chosen for their respective parts, and they lend remarkable authenticity to the various scenes. At the head of the cast of some three dozen principals may be

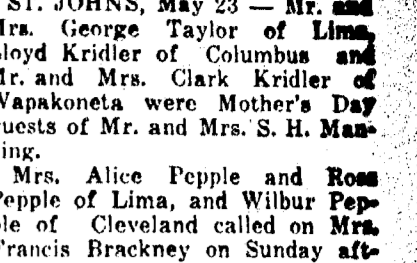
