BLAMES STALIN

MEXICO CITY, May 25-(UP) -Leon Trotsky, exiled Russian revolutionary, charged last night that his enemy, Josef Stalin, had "personally directed" the attempt to assassinate him yesterday morning.

The left-wing newspaper "El Popular" charged today that Trotsky had staged the raid, possibly with the aid of agents of the Dies committee of the United States congress, investigating un-American activities, to provide an excuse for United States intervention in Mexico.

The paper said the incident was staged more for the benefit of the United States than for the Mexican public. It said the "false assault construed a dire provocation against Mexico," since it came only 48 hours after President Lazaro Cardenas "proved" that socalled fifth column activities in Mexico were merely emanations from various internal and external political factions.
