During his last two years in California Sheets' pictures won several prizes and attracted the attention of Dazell Hatfield, art dealer, who invited him to get ready a oneman show in his galleries in

May, 1929. Two months before the exhibition opened, he entered the David competition at the Witte Memorial gallery of San Antonio, and won a \$1,750 prize for his painting, "The Goat Ranch." This gained national attention for him, and his one-man show at the Hatfield galleries was one of the most succesful ever held in America. It was followed by invitations to exhibit in all parts of the coun-

Since that time he has had more than 39 one-man shows, including those at the Museum of Modern Art in New York, the Witte Galleries in California, and the Chicago Art Institute.

Millard Sheets was offered a regular position on the Chouinard staff when he returned from Europe, and shortly afterwards the Chair of Art at Scripps college at Claremount, Calif., and the directorship of the Los Angeles County Fair art depart-


