110 Plants in State Join WDIA Plan to Boost Dairying

More than 110 dairy plants with a total annual butterfat intake of nearly 20 million pounds have joined the program of the Wisconsin Dairy Industries Assn. since the close of the recent membership drive early in May, according to Lee I. Yorkson, acting secretary of the association.

Supervisor of secondary schools and senior chef were announced today by the state bureau of personnel. Closing date for applications for the school supervisor position, which pays \$300 a month, is June 22, the bureau said. The senior chef position pays \$200 per month and the closing date for applications is also June 22. The chef is responsible for the proper management of all activities carried on in the kitchens either of the Wisconsin Union or of a major dormitory unit at the University of Wisconsin.

Dairy Bonding Law Object of Suit

The planning committee is headed by Bruce Landt, president of the W. D. I. A., who received his appointment as chairman recently. First contributions to the W. D. I. A. will be made during the month of August by 120,000 farmer members. The state program is voluntary and each member agrees to contribute 1/2 cent on every pound of butterfat delivered to the factory during August.

Third of State's Milk Production Goes to Butter

Nearly 3,700,000,000 pounds of milk, almost a third of the state's total milk production, were used in Wisconsin last year in the manufacture of creamery butter, according to the crop reporting service of the Wisconsin and United States departments of agriculture. Estimates of butter production indicate last year the state's output was about 176,000,000 pounds, or more than 10 per cent of all the butter made in the nation annually.

Record Year Predicted for Feeds, Fertilizers

Records are being broken on the Wisconsin feed and fertilizer front, the state department of agriculture reports. More feeds, and fertilizers already have been registered with the department than in any previous year. Registered during the first five months of 1940 were 4,780 different brands of feed and analyzed. Only two samples showed a serious deficiency.
