

Pearce Will Present Young Singing Star Friday Night

Warren Lustre, 14-Year-Old Soprano, To Be Heard At 6:30 P. M.; Abbott And Costello Headline Kate Smith Show

Al Pearce will present the second of his pre-talent "finds" during his program on WABC Friday at 6:30 p. m. This week's guest will be Warren Lustre, 14-year-old boy soprano of San Antonio, Texas. Young Lustre has been featured in that city for some time. He will be accompanied on his trip to Hollywood for the Pearce broadcast by his mother.

Abbott and Costello, who replace Fred Allen July 31, head a trio of comedy acts that will feature an unusual "Kate Smith Hour" Friday, at 7:00 p. m., over WABC.

A fast-moving mystery story, "Grim Gault," an original by Marcin, will be the "Johnny Crime" vehicle on "Johnny Presents" over WABC Friday, at 8 p. m. Directed by Jack Johnstone, the story features Inspector Ross and Step-Down Donovan, played by Walter Grezza and Phil Tully, respectively. Music will be under the baton of Johnny Green. He will feature solo spots by his ace instrumentalists as well as vocals by Audrey Marsh and the Swing Fourteen. The maestro's own piano solos will be another highlight.

Taylor And Miss Leigh To Open At The Ohio Saturday

"Waterloo Bridge" Is Timely Picture Of Love In A War-Torn Country; "My Favorite Wife" Ends Run Friday

Balancing a tender and beautiful love story against a powerful dramatic war background, "Waterloo Bridge," commencing Saturday at the Ohio theatre, stars Robert Taylor and Vivien Leigh in a timely picture. Showing for the last times Friday is "My Favorite Wife," a comedy starring Cary Grant, Irene Dunne, Randolph Scott and Gail Patrick.

"On Their Own," starring the Jones family, commences Friday evening at the Quilna preview. The glamorous dancing star, Zorina, heads the cast of "I Was an Adventuress," with Richard Greene, Erich Von Stroheim and Peter Lorre. Showing for the last times Friday is "Four Sons."

"Two Girls on Broadway," the dramatic story with a musical background now at the Sigma, answers the growing cry of audiences for "streamlined musicals" in the picture starring George Murphy, Lana Turner and Joan Blondell, offering the thrill of good music and dancing without letting the story drop. Also showing is "Granny Get Your Gun," starring May Robson.

A fast-moving, clever mystery picture, "The Mysterious Mr. Reeder," is the current Lyric feature, with Will Fyffe, the star, seen as the affable, seemingly benevolent but crafty investigator of Scotland Yard. Bela Lugosi is the star of the co-feature, "The Human Monster," a blood-curdling horror film.

The State theatre offers one of the top western comedies of the year in "My Little Chickadee," with Mae West and W. C. Fields in the starring roles. The co-feature, "Slightly Honorable," stars Pat O'Brien, Broderick Crawford and Ruth Terry in a top-notch mystery film.

One of the most memorable romances ever written for the stage, Robert E. Sherwood's "Waterloo Bridge" has been made into a timely and tender love story, starring Vivien Leigh and Robert Taylor, and coming Saturday to the Ohio theatre.

With its vital and exciting background of London of the war years, 1917 and 1940, the story is woven around a ballet dancer and an aristocratic young British officer, who meet on historic Waterloo Bridge during an air raid and seek shelter in the Waterloo underground. They realize that they are in love almost at first sight and their whirlwind courtship is telescoped into twenty-four happy hours. But before they can be married he is called back to the front. Later she reads his name among the dead and life fails to hold anything for her. Their


as lovely Marguerite Chapman, with whom Jack falls in love at first sight; Charles Jules, his Latin accent and his eight bamboos; Chick Chandler, the irresponsible comical who has, for "On Their Own," a troupe of trained dogs; Forrester Harvey, the slightly balmly inventor, and an affected ex-actress, Isobel Randolph.

Said to be the merriest of all the Jones Family pictures, "On Their Own" reaches a new high in solid entertainment in the stirring court room scene that fittingly climaxes it.

Miss Leigh is the most talked of actress on the screen today as the result of her Academy Award performance of Scarlett O'Hara in "Gone with the Wind." In Roy Cronin, the young officer, Taylor has been given the most mature and dynamically virile characterization of his career. He undergoes an age transition from a man of 25 to 48, giving him greater scope than in any role he has ever portrayed on the screen.
