# WHEAT ACREAGE ALLOTMENTS IN PUTNAM MAILED

(Lima News Bureau) OTTAWA, July 8.—Individual wheat allotments have been mailed to Putnam farmers, it was announced today by Arnold J. Schroeder, chairman of the county AAA committee.

Each farmer has 15 days from the issuance date in which to file appeals with the county committee in writing, the chairman explained. Some of the allotments were dated July 6 and others July 8, so that the deadlines will be either July 21 or 23, Schroeder pointed out.

These allotments are for 1941 wheat plantings. A total of 43,500 acres have been allotted the whole county under the AAA program which is about the same as for 1940 wheat, according to the chairman.

He also announced that Aug. 31 has been set as the deadline for winter wheat growers to request measurements to determine eligibility for 1941 wheat party payments, for crop insurance applications.

# Tobacco Forms Major Revenue For 300,000

ATLANTA, July 9.—(AP)—Some curls from curing barns in the southeast's tobacco land, starting another luxury crop of cigarette leaf toward markets.

Upwards of 300,000 southern farmers look to flue-cured tobacco, the type used principally for cigarettes and snuff, for a major part of their annual income. They set out plants this year under controls intended to restrict production to less than 700,000,000 pounds, for a nation that consumes between 550,000,000 and 400,000,000 pounds annually. The remainder was aimed at the export trade, dwindled now a mere trickle because of the loss of European and British markets.

Unseasonal cold weather delayed the crop in some sections as much as two weeks, but the broad leafed plants are ripening in Florida, Georgia, eastern Alabama and South Carolina, and growers are working on 24-hour shifts in the most nerve-racking part of their job, treating the leaf by heat. One acre of bright leaf tobacco may yield from 700 to 900 pounds of saleable leaf, bringing possibly an average of 15 cents a pound. J. B. Hutson, assistant Agricultural Adjustment Administrator, said arrangements would be made, subject to approval of the three-year control program, for the Commodity Credit Corp. to buy most of the surplus of 100,000,000 to 150,000,000 pounds expected this season.

There is already a heavy carry-over of bright leaf from previous seasons in warehouses.

# CHICAGO PLANS GOOD TIME FOR ALL DELEGATES

CHICAGO, July 9.—(INS)—All persons attending the Democratic national convention in Chicago next week on convention business will find that the city has gone far toward saving wear and tear on their pocketbooks.

This was revealed today with announcement of steps the city has taken to insure a good time for all conventioners. In a letter to 5,000 official convention-goers, Mayor Edward J. Kelly's Citizens' committee informs the prospective visitors that they will find Chicago a "friendly home-like host" which has a "warm-hearted welcome" ready for them.

The lucky convention guests, including delegates, alternates, party officials, newspapermen, photographers and radio men, will receive cards, signed by the mayor, entitling them to free admission to all Chicago Cubs' baseball games; all loop motion picture houses; Arlington Park race track; the art institute; Shedd aquarium; the industrial museum; the Negro world's fair, and a big police and firemen's show at Soldier field.

The visitors also will enjoy special privileges at various clubs in the city, and at golf courses. In addition, there will be the usual round of receptions, luncheons, dinners and suppers—all on the house.

# SAFETY STAUNCHIONS IN CLEVELAND ARE BANNED

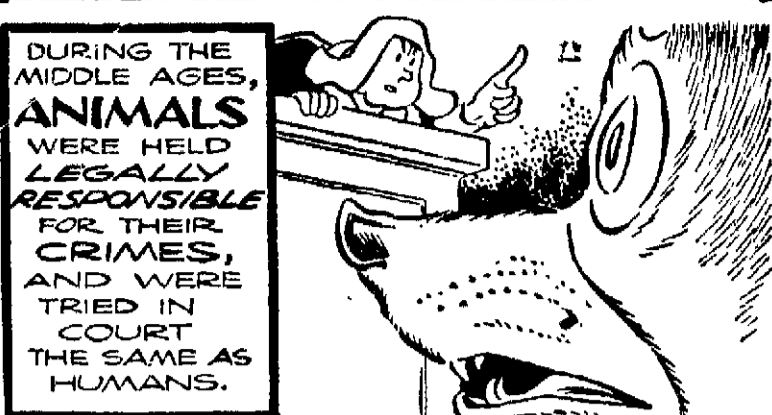
CLEVELAND, July 9.—(AP)—City council has sounded the death knell for 100 permanent safety staunchions which figured in numerous fatal traffic crashes.

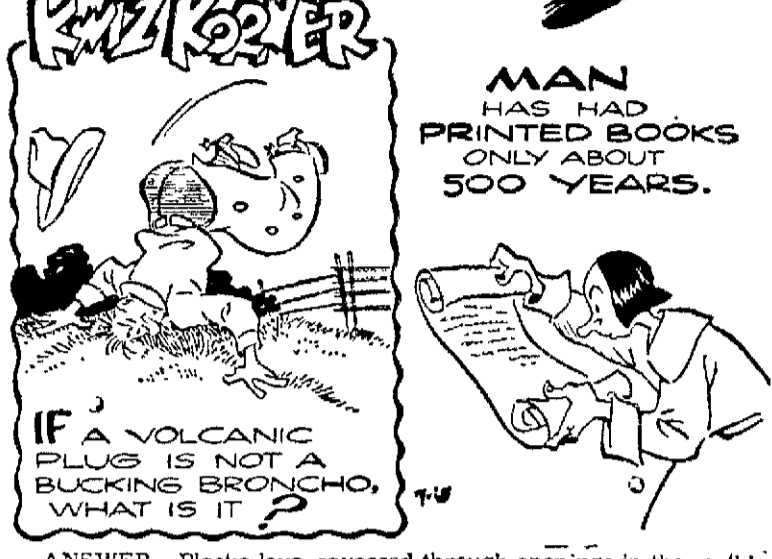
# YOUTHS TAKE CHARGE

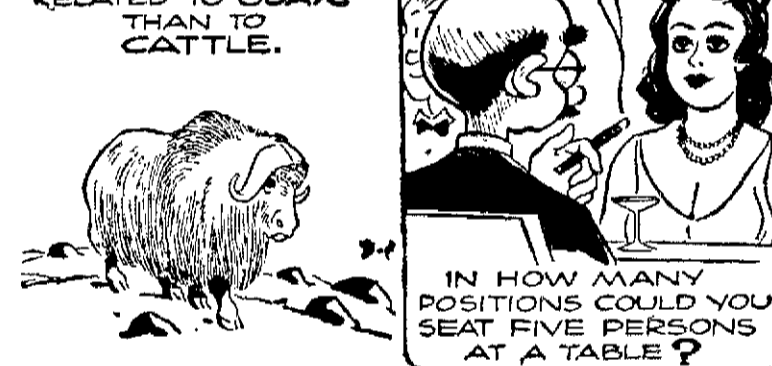

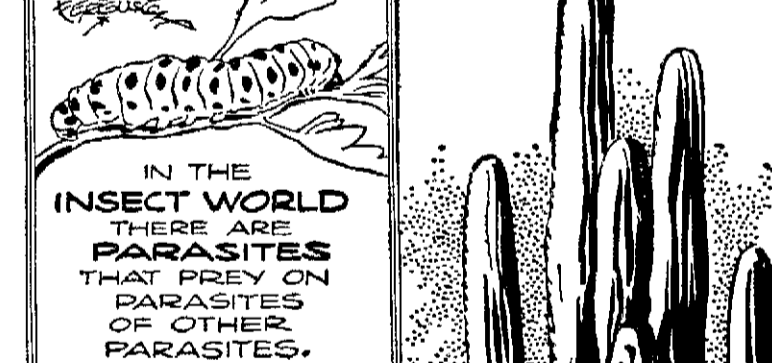
