REGULAR ARMY OFFICERS LOSE R. O. T. C. POSTS

COLUMBUS, O., July 12—(UP)—Brigadier General C. B. Hodges, commanding general of the Fifth Corps area, today announced replacement of 38 regular army officers on reserve officers' training corps duty in 13 colleges by reserve officers or retired regular officers called back to duty.

The substitutions are being made in order that regular officers may report for duty in the expanding regular army.

The replacements by schools will include nine officers at Ohio State; two at Cincinnati; one at Dayton; two at Ohio U.; one at Akron; two at Xavier, three at West Virginia. The replacements will be made between now and opening of academic terms next fall.

TANK ABOARD LARGE TRUCK WRECKS LIGHTS

(Lima News Bureau) FINDLAY, July 12—A R. Cole, Findlay service-safety director, said today he had no objection to the kind of vehicles which traversed Main-st. but he did oppose tearing down the city's white-way lights.

The matter came to issue yesterday when a large oil tank was being hauled thru Main-st. on a truck shattering two street lights and tearing down a guy wire. Cole, hearing of the incident, jumped into the side-car of Patrolman Ray Pruitt's cycle and gave chase.

He informed the truckers they had failed to get a permit for moving the huge tank thru the city, when he caught up with them at the north city limits. They purchased the permit and continued.

The tank was a part of the old Montgomery Refining Co. plant, southwest of here, which has been sold to the Dewese refinery at Weston, Wood-co. The equipment is being moved to its new location, but in the future, large tanks will be dismantled before they are loaded on a truck, Dewese said.

LOCAL RESIDENTS SEEK TO CARE FOR CHILDREN FROM WAR-TORN EUROPE

As pleasant, earnest Mrs. Olin Laughlin, 724 N. Charles-st., bends over her household duties, her thoughts are far away.

In her mind she strains to hear the whine of falling bombs, the dull, jolting thunder of earth-wrecking explosions, the rattle of guns, the screams.

With a worried frown she thinks of her father, her sisters and brother. And their children. "I wish I had them 'ere," she exclaims, her speech revealing a rich accent, half English and half Irish. (Her father, Henry Myers, was born in Ireland.)

"I wish they were 'ere, so they wouldn't get bombed and all that stuff!"

Of course, the grownups can't come, Mrs. Laughlin knows. They are needed at home.

But the children... If the children could be brought to America they could be spared the horrors, the suffering, the possible death. And, Mrs. Laughlin believes, at a time when democracy seems to be waning, the children would learn in the United States that democracy still lives.

COMMITTEE TO AID IN NEW YORK One day Mrs. Laughlin asked her husband, a Lima letter carrier, to inquire of the Allen-co Red Cross if there was any way to bring some of her nieces and nephews to America.

They got a letter in reply which told them to write to: Miss Agnes Inglis, U. S. Committee for Care of European Children, 215 Fourth-av, New York, N. Y.

This committee, they were told, places with responsible families
