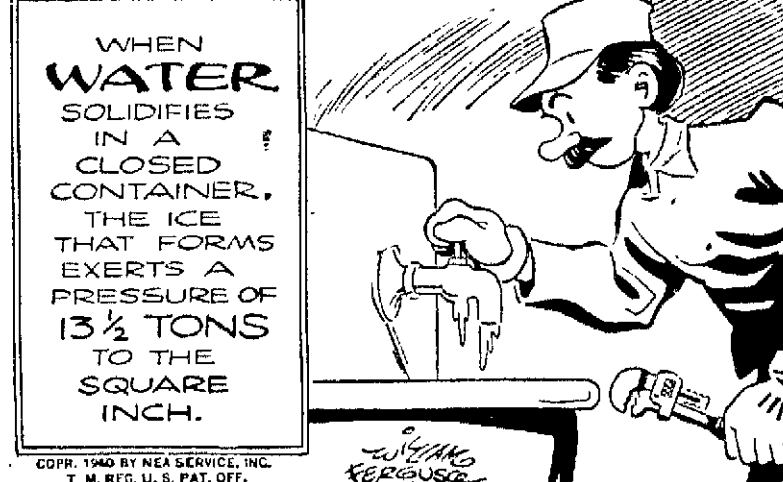

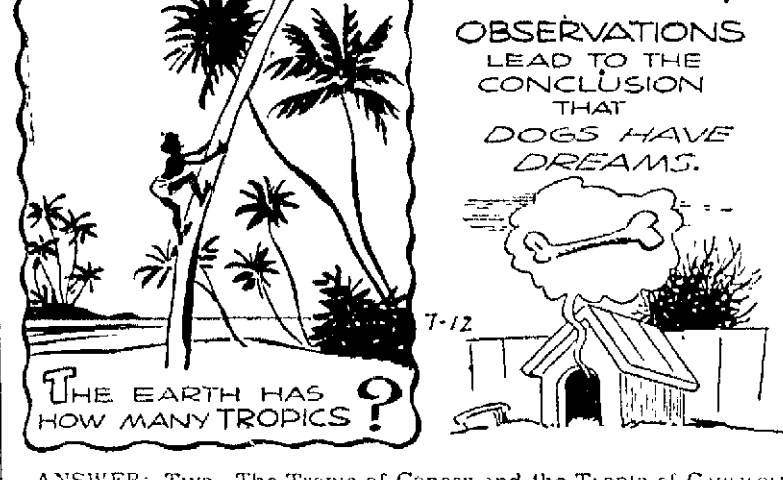

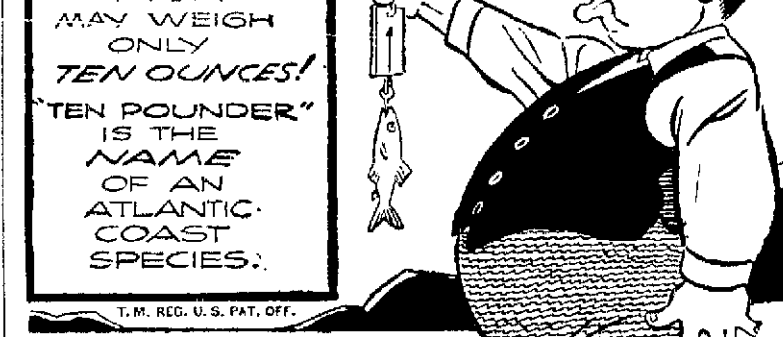

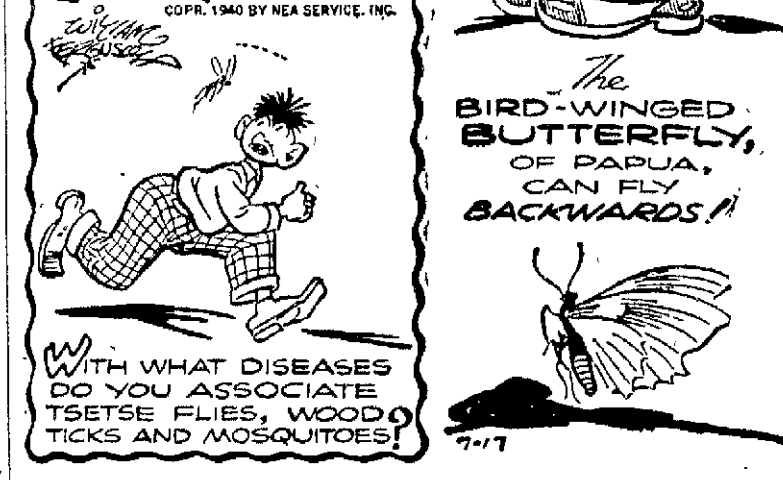

New Double Bill Scheduled Friday Evening At Quilna

"Out West With The Peppers" And "The Lone Wolf Meets A Lady" Will Be Presented At Regular Preview Showing

"Out West With The Peppers," a story of the adventures of fiction's merriest family off in the great northwest woods, opens Friday evening at the Quilna theatre, Edith Fellows and Dorothy Peterson are in the leading roles. "The Lone Wolf Meets A Lady," starring Roger Pryor, Jean Muir and Warren William, also will show. "The Awful Truth," and "Lost Horizon," ends Friday afternoon.

Premiere showing of "All This and Heaven Too," one of the greatest love stories of all time, will be staged at 8:30 p. m. Thursday at the Ohio theatre. Rated as a picture which belongs in the same class as "Gone With the Wind," it is the highly dramatic story of a little French governess, seemingly destined for a life of spinsterhood, who became the center of a Parisian marriage scandal which shook Europe nearly a century ago, but who survived the ordeal to find peace and happiness in America. Bette Davis and Charles Boyer have principal roles.

One of the world's most basic combinations — a boy and his dog — provides the theme for Hollywood's new offering, "The Biscuit Eater," a story of southern country life, now at the Sigma. "You Can't Fool Your Wife," a rollicking comedy with Lucille Ball, James Ellison and Robert Coote, completes the program.

"Til We Meet Again," which opens Thursday at the State for a three-day run, is a story of a girl, played by Merle Oberon, and a man, George Brent, who have but one month to live. The girl suffers from heart trouble and the man is to be executed. How they spend this month makes an interesting story. "The Cavalcade of Academy Awards" also will be shown.

Opening Thursday at the Lyric theatre are two first run attractions. "On the Spot," an action picture, features Frankie Darro and "Riders of Pasco Basin," a thrilling western hit, stars Johnny Mack Brown, Bob Baker and Fuzzy Knight.

OHIO
"All This and Heaven Too," the brilliant novel by Rachel Field, which has become one of the best-selling books of the decade, now comes to the screen in all its dramatic essence with Bette Davis and Charles Boyer in the starring roles. The film will have its premiere preview showing at 8:30 p. m. Thursday at the Ohio theatre.

The novel was the story of Rachel Field's own great-aunt from the time she, a young girl with a past somewhat shrouded in mystery, left a temporary refuge in England, to return to France, her birthplace, there to become governess in the household of the Duc de Praslin, royalist close to King Louis Philippe, in those years prior to his, the Duc's, suicidal death in 1847, the death that ended, but did not completely solve the famous Praslin murder mystery.

The picture covers only those nine intensely dramatic years from 1841 to 1849, which marked Henriette Desputes' stay in the Praslin household as governess to four children who loved her more deeply than they loved their own strange mother, up thru the murder trial in which she was tragically involved, to her arrival in New York after her exonerated, where she became teacher of French in a fashionable school, soon thereafter the wife of young Henry Fielding. Against a glamorous Manhattan background, the Hardy family has once again woven a tale of hilarious comedy and poignant human drama in "Andy Hardy Meets Debutante," is the current attraction at the Ohio theatre.
