George Young, 45, of Lima, sentenced from Hancock for his part in the hijacking of a truck load of eggs cast of Findlay, has been granted a parole from Ohio penitentiary in Columbus, authorities learned here today.

Young, Gerald (Jack) Vorhes, 35, and Paul Strome, 40, all of Lima, were sentenced in 1933 on charges of armed robbery. Young and Strome went to the pen. Vorhes was sentenced to the Mansfield reformatory from which he escaped in 1936 only to be captured later in Canada.

He was granted a parole in 1938. As far as is known here, Strome still is being held.

The case attracted state-wide attention due to the fact the three men nearly caused the death of two Celina truckers whom they bound and carried in the rear of a coupe from east of Findlay to Lima and back into Hardin-co near Forest where they were released and their empty truck returned to them.

By checking the mileage on the truck with the mileage on other trucks also hijacked by the trio, Sheriff Lyle A. Harvitt ascertained that Lima must be the city where the eggs were being unloaded.
