Measure Would Aid Conservation Program, Auglaize Agent Believes

Wapakoneta, July 27—Adoption of a land zoning law in Ohio which would permit county governments to say, "no farming here," and enforcement of the same was advocated today by Clarence D. Brown, Auglaize-co agricultural agent.

Brown admitted that adoption of such a law would have little effect in this part of the state, but at the same time he pointed out that such a program would tend to eliminate relief and soil problems.

A land zoning law in Ohio would prove of great benefit in southeastern and southern Ohio, and do much to minimize the danger of floods.
