WASHINGTON-In an official report on American Red Cross war relief activities in Europe, Chairman Norman H. Davis last week vigorously denied rumors Red Cross supplies had been seized by any of the belligerent countries and disclosed the goal of the \$20,000,000 war relief fund is "in sight."

The fund today totalled \$19,-823,510, he said. Referring to rumors that Germany had confiscated American Red Cross' sup-S:0(--WJD WCCO 5:15-WIBA WBBM 5:15-WCCO WMAQ plies and funds, he declared, "I want to assure the American people there is no foundation whatsoever for such reports. I am able to state categorically that the German authorities have not selzed one cent of Red Cross funds nor have they taken a single item of our supplies."

The Red Cross does not intend to engage in any relief program without adequate control over its. operations, he said, reiterating none of the war relief funds is spent on the normal program of the Red Cross.


