

American Chinese General To Be Oddity Show Guest

Bert Hall, Known As General Chan, Set On "Strange As It Seems" Broadcast Scheduled For 7:30 P. M.

Bert Hall, who was the first man to employ the plane as an instrument of war—and who once was known as General Chan in the Chinese Nationalist forces, will make a guest appearance on the "Strange As It Seems" program, Thursday, WABC, 7:30 p. m.

Hall, during the World war, ran up a score of 17 air victories and made practical the tactic of transporting spies across enemy borders. It was during his engagement as a flier for the Chinese Nationalist government several years ago that he became tagged General Chan—a name that he retained for a number of years.

In addition to airing two new songs for the first time, Bing Crosby will introduce Pat O'Brien, Lou Holtz, Muriel Angelus, and the Kiddoolers to listeners Thursday. The broadcast over WEAJ at 8:00 p. m. will also feature the vocal antics of the Music Males and the music of John Scott Trotter's orchestra.

The two tunes to be unveiled by Bing are "That's For Me" and "When the Moon Comes Over Madison Square." For his memory number he'll do "When I Lost You," in addition to "Ceilia" and "When the Swallows Come Back to Capistrano."

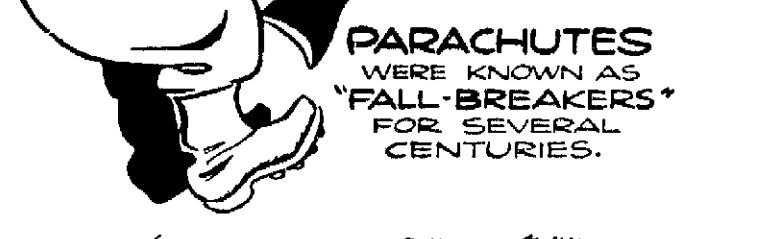

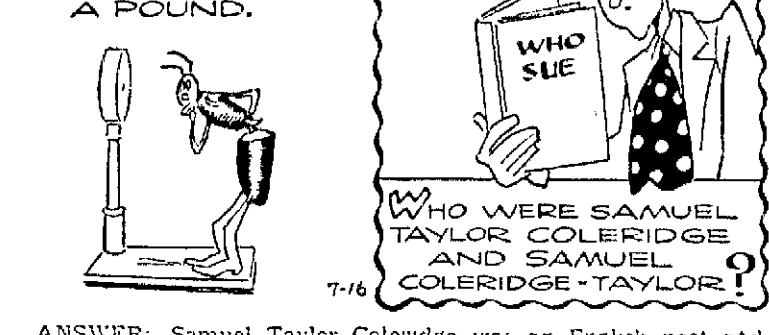

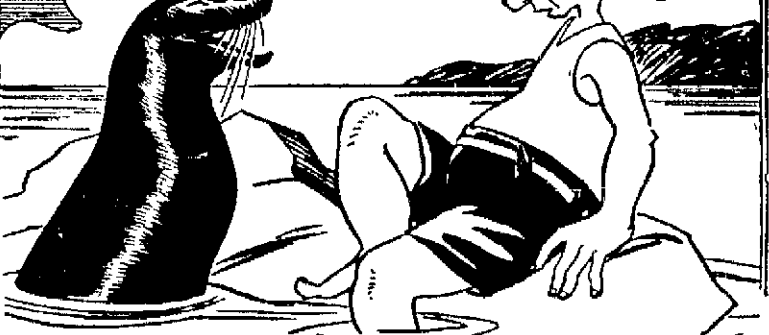


PARACHUTES

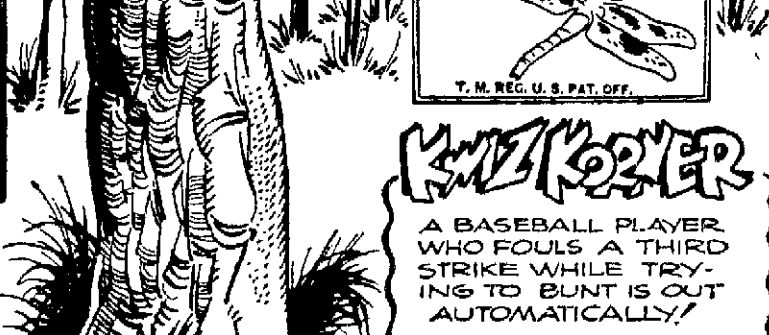

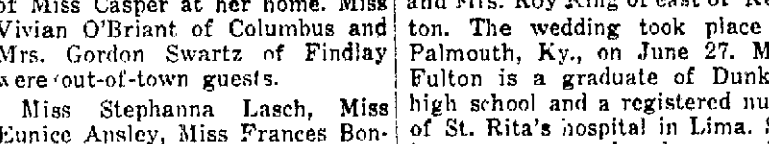
