COLUMBUS, O., Aug. 8.—(INS)—Opening of a new state park on Crawford Island in Lake Loramie, Shelby-co, was announced today by Conservation Commissioner Don Waters. The park, which is open to picnickers and campers, was constructed thru general revenue funds. Plans for 1941 include the construction of a public boating and fishing dock, a bathing beach, field sports areas, and a bridge from the west bank to shorten by two miles the approach to the park from the north, Waters said.
