Interview With National Defense Council Tops Tonight's Airwaves

League Title Races Reach Crucial Stage

Championship fights in several southern state baseball leagues will reach a "make or break" stage Sunday when some of the most important games of the rapidly ebbing 1940 season will be played.

Only two outright titlists have been determined to date and both of them are in the large Home Talent League. Dodgeville and Madison 3F Laundry, which also rate as the only teams in southern Wisconsin unbeaten in league competition, have clinched outright sectional titles in the Western and East Madison sections, respectively.

The Central Wisconsin, Sauk County, Scenic Wisconsin, Northern Tri-County, and Sugar River Valley leagues will hold the spotlight along with the Home Talent loop Sunday.

Waunakee is at Wyoceca in the Home Talent's big game. The teams will be staking their hopes of bagging the Northern section flag won by Waunakee for the past three seasons. Currently Waunakee is tied with Springfield for the sectional lead with Wyoceca only a half-game behind.

Springfield will have Ashton's tough young club to contend with. John Simon's club barely nipped Ashton, 1-0, in their first meeting this season.

Waunakee defeated Wyoceca, 5-4, on June 16 with the winning run scoring on a balk with two out in the ninth. Wyoceca protested the defeat, questioning the umpire's judgment in calling the balk. League directors upheld the protest but later it was discarded by the league appeal board.

Cross Plains challenges Mt. Horeb's lead in the Southern section and is given a 50-50 chance of springing an upset since Mt. Horeb is weakened through the loss of its ace pitcher, Ken Fjelstad, who leaves Friday morning to join the U. S. marine corps. Either Julian Johnson or Manager "Pinney" Faust will take Fjelstad's place on the hill Sunday in opposition to Cross Plains' young star, "Red" Baer. Mt. Horeb won, 5-3, previously.

Middleton's league champions hope to stay a half-game behind Mt. Horeb, and possibly take over first place should the latter lose, as they invade Black Earth. The game will feature a "Booster Day" program at Black Earth and the host club is primed for an upset.

Regardless of the outcome of the Waunakee-Wyoceca tilt, Springfield will clinch at least a tie for the Northern section flag if it defeats Ashton. Likewise, South Side Men's club and McFarland can clinch at least ties for the West Madison and Eastern section pennants by winning.

If South Side defeats the Wrend Builders and Gardner Bakery should upset the Penn Electric the Southsiders would clinch the undisputed West Madison flag. But, the best McFarland can get is a tie since its co-leader, London, is idle. If it wins and Middleton loses, Mt. Horeb will gain a tie for the Southern section title.

3F Laundry will be gunning to finish its league schedule unde-

feated as it meets the second place Simon Pures at Annen's field. Cottage Grove holds the key to the outcome of the Eastern section race. It meets McFarland Sunday and London on Aug. 18 and if it wins one of the games it will determine the sectional champion.

The chances of either Lake Mills or Waterloo overtaking Jefferson in the Central Wisconsin league will be at stake as those two teams meet at Waterloo. Each has lost three games.

LaRue can win the second half championship in the Sauk County League by defeating the second place Cazenovia club, but if the latter wins it can finish in a tie with the Miners, or possibly beat them out for the second half flag. Cazenovia won, 11-2, when the two teams met in the first half.

In the Scenic Wisconsin the second place Lone Rock nine meets the third place Reedsburg club in the feature game. Richland Center should defeat Baraboo easily to maintain the lead.

Riley can pack away the undisputed title in the Sugar River Valley League by defeating Camp Mt. Horeb CCC. The CCC nine is the only team to defeat Riley this season, doing it by a 7-4 score. Riley gained a tie for the title last Sunday as Blooming Grove was beaten by the Perry Cubs.

Paesetting Portage meets Briggsville in the Northern Tri-County League feature. Briggsville, trailing by one game, can gain a tie for first place by winning.

The Southern Wisconsin league opens its third round schedule with one game—Atton at Beloit Goodalls. The Goodalls have been conceded the second round flag since the Beloit Cubs have also withdrawn from the league. The league directors drew up a third round schedule Tuesday night; only six teams remain in the league.

The championship of the County Line League hinges on a remaining game between the leading New-
