10 A. M., WRC—Albert Stoessel conducts a Young People's Concert by the Chautauqua Symphony: Overture, "Mignon," Thomas; Two Norwegian Dances, Grieg; "Finnish Lullaby," Palmgren; "Praeludium," Jaernefelt; Dance of the Comedians, "The Bartered Bride," Smetaha.

10:30, WJSV—The Dorian String Quartet programs Malipiero's "Rispettie Strambotti" and Aaron Copland's "Lento Molto and Rondino."

11, WOL—Rear Admiral Russell R. Waesche, commandant of the U. S. Coast Guard, speaks at the dedication of the U. S. Coast Guard station at Cleveland in observance of the Guard's 150th anniversary.

12 NOON, WJSV—Vesta Eales, the book lady, interviews Alice Rogers Hager, author of "Wings Over the Americas."

3, WRC—The Budapest String Quartet plays Mozart's Quartet in A major and Sibelius' "Voces Intimae" in the auditorium of the Library of Congress.

4:30, WOL—The running of the Alabama Handicap at Saratoga.

6, WJSV—Four prominent newspapermen discuss America's defense problem in the face of war abroad: Edmond Taylor, author of "The Strategy of Terror;" Robert Neville, foreign news editor of PM; Seymour Berkson, night managing editor of INS, and Fletcher Pratt, military expert of the New York Post.
