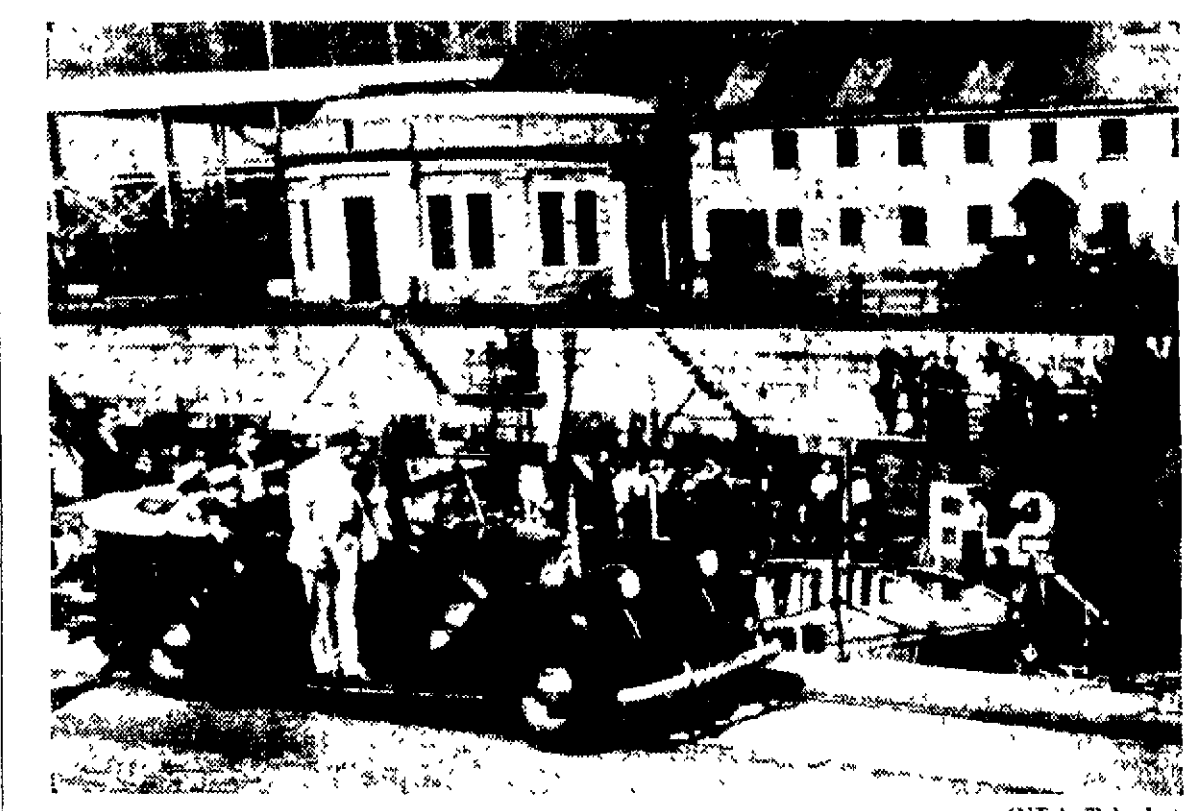

Charlie Ruggles, Janice Logan, Robert Paige and William Frawley are the stars of the film. Co-featured will be "Ladies Must Live," with Wayne Morris and Priscilla Lane in the lead roles. Showing for the last time Tuesday is "One Million B. C."

The romance and adventure of the Old West is vividly brought to the screen in "Bullet Code," George O'Brien's latest starring vehicle, which commences at the Lyric theatre Wednesday. The co-feature, "Full Confession," stars Victor McLaglen and Sally Eilers. Showing for the last time Tuesday is "Missing Evidence" and "Call a Messenger."

Joan Bennett and Francis Lederer are the romantic starring duo of the Quilna feature, "The Man I Married," a picture based on the amazing experiences with a beautiful girl who thought she knew. Included in the stellar cast of the dramatic offering are Lloyd Nolan, Marie Ouspenskaya, and Otto Kruger.

William Powell and Myrna Loy are starred in the Ohio feature "I Love You Again," one of the top-notch comedies of the season. Powell, as a crook who regains his memory after nine years of amnesia to find himself married to a beautiful and loving wife, and Miss Loy, the wife who finds her penny-pinching unromantic husband suddenly exciting and extravagant, offer a rare comedy treat.

Jimmy Cagney, Pat O'Brien and Ann Sheridan are the trio of big names offered in the State film, "Torrid Zone," a story of rubber plantation bosses and a stranded American beauty, in South America. The co-feature, "The Farmer's Daughter," brings Charlie Ruggles and Martha Raye together for the first time in a tip-top rural comedy.

A sure cure for the blues, rating a laugh a minute, is now at the Ohio theatre where "I Love You Again," co-starring William Powell and Myrna Loy is now showing. The film, presenting a fast-moving, laugh-packed series of situations, deals with the plight of a man who suddenly recovers from an eight-year attack of amnesia and discovers that during that time he has acquired a new personality, a charming wife who is about to divorce him, a spotless reputation as the leader of a community called Haversville, a bank account and the manager's berth in a large pottery firm.

Powell has never had a happier screen role. The opportunity to portray a character decidedly different from the suave, polished detective in the early portion of the film, is something to see. Imagine him, if you can, with a frowzy moustache, tight pants, white shoes and a hobby of amateur taxidermy.

Once again Myrna Loy is cast as his wife, but she's not the perfect spouse on this occasion. As a matter of fact, the usual procedure is reversed, with Powell forced to chase after her instead of the opposite. A strong supporting cast turning in top performances includes Frank McHugh as Powell's pal, "Doc" Ryan, Edmund Lowe as a slick oil promoter, Dixie Douglas as the rival for Miss
