

# Thrilling Stunt-Man Drama On Manhattan At Midnight

## Expose Of Extortion From Truck Owners Listed On District Attorney Spot; Ginny Schedules Solos

The smashing sound of an automobile tearing thru a stone wall at 90 miles per hour provides but one of the thrilling scenes to be enacted on the "Manhattan At Midnight" drama over WJZ Wednesday at 7:30 p. m.

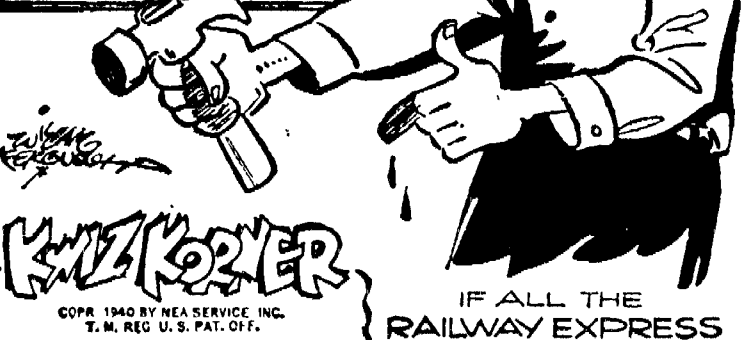
**KENTON VETERANS MEET**

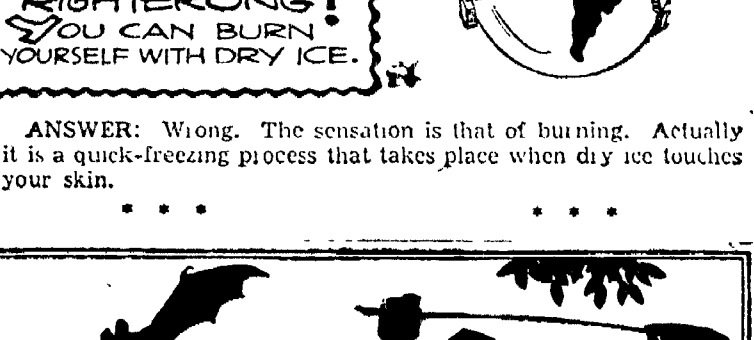

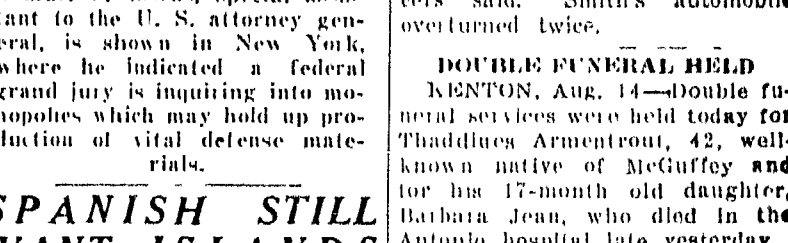
