**SURPLUS FOOD PLAN CHANGED**

New Schedule of Distribution Will Be Effective Next Week

Change in distribution schedule for surplus commodities to Allen county recipients was announced Thursday by Harry R. Corwin, county area relief supervisor. It will be effective next week.

In the future old age pension recipients who receive surplus food must call at the distribution center, 223 S. Main-st., on Wednesdays. And for dependent children and blind pension recipients will be given their allocations on Thursday. Direct relief recipients are divided between Tuesday and Thursday.

This week the Allen-co center distributed bacon, eggs and prunes. Corwin said two carloads of meat, one of graham flour and the other of corn meal, were received this week. Part of it was redistributed to other counties.

Following is the graham flour allocation, in pounds, by counties: Allen, 15,876; Auglaize, 4,116; Mercer, 4,116; Paulding, 4,704; Putnam, 8,232; and Shelby, 4,116. The car contained 41,160 pounds of flour.

The corn meal allocation was: Allen, 26,000; Auglaize, 8,000; Mercer, 4,000; Paulding, 4,000; Putnam, 10,000; and Henry, 8,000. The car contained 60,000 pounds.

**RAIDERS COPY CARRIE NATION IN OKLAHOMA**

OKLAHOMA CITY, Okla., Aug. 15.—(UP)—State highway patrolmen are resorting to the Carrie Nation technique of 20 years ago in chopping up bootleg establishments during liquor raids.

An intensive campaign to force swank speakeasies out of business was instigated as a move for prohibition repeal gained momentum. Oklahoma is one of the three remaining dry states in the country.

The chopping up of furniture in "night spots" was applauded both by wet and dry leaders.

The wets contend that the campaign will force thirsty state residents to push the repeal initiated petition. Dry leaders say the dawn of an "enforced prohibition" is at hand.

State Patrol Chief Walter Johnson opened the ax-swinging assault on night clubs, leading a squad of six patrol investigators into several establishments at Tulsa. All were armed with axes.

Wrecking of several taverns at Tulsa was followed by an assault on a "supper club" here.

At the same time, the Federal court has ruled that dealers handling 3.2 beer are prohibited from selling to restricted Indians. A drive was opened to limit the sale of rubbing alcohol and bay rum after Indians turned to drug stores for their intoxicating beverages.
